- ❖ College library has around 66742 books in various subjects and languages like English, Konkani, Hindi, Marathi, Portuguese, Sanskrit, and Urdu.
- ❖ The library books are stacked as per Dewey decimal classification system. This results in students getting the desired book without wasting time.
- ❖ The library is fully computerized using NewGenLib library automation software and uses all the modules.
- ❖ It has a very valuable treasure of textbooks, reference books, Encyclopedias, rare books, and dictionaries
- ❖ The journal collection includes more than 130 National and International journals.
