The journey continued to Dharamshala, where students visited the serene Dalai Lama Temple, St. John's Church, and Naddi

The next destination was Manali, where students enjoyed the breathtaking views of Snow Point, known for its pristine beauty. They explored the Hadimba Temple, renowned for its architecture and spiritual significance, and the Vashisth Kund, famous for its hot water springs. Visits to Tibetan monasteries gave the students insights into Tibetan culture and Buddhism. In Kullu, the group visited the Vaishno Devi Temple and witnessed traditional shawl factory which provided practical insights into traditional industries. Finally, the group left for Goa, concluding a trip filled with knowledge and experiences. This study tour was not just about sightseeing but about immersing oneself in the rich history, diverse cultures, and the beauty of India. Students gained insights into the diverse cultures of North India, including Punjabi, Tibetan, and Himachali traditions. Exposure to new environments fostered adaptability, teamwork, and independence among students.
