	patriarchal society.
	Despite facing opposition from nobles who believed that women had
	no place in ruling, Razia's intelligence, political acumen, and
	leadership qualities shone through. She managed the empire with
	efficiency, gaining respect for her military and administrative
	decisions. Her reign is marked by reforms, promoting merit over
	nobility, and championing social justice.
	Razia's rule was cut short by betrayal and political intrigue, but her
	legacy remains an inspiration for women in leadership roles. She
	demonstrated that leadership is not defined by gender, but by one's
	ability to govern wisely and justly. Razia Sultana's story continues to
	break barriers and inspire people, especially women, to pursue their
	dreams regardless of societal limitations.
