	On January 31, 2025, the Department of Economics at St. Xavier's
	College organized a field trip to Ela Farm, GIPARD, and the Pilar
	Museum. 62 Economics students from FYBA, SYBA and TYBA
	accompanied by the faculty members of the Department took part in the
	field trip
	The key objectives for the Educational Visit:
	1. To understand sustainable agricultural practices by exploring organic farming and soil conservation at Ela Farm (GIPARD).
	2. To explore Goa's historical and cultural heritage through artifacts, manuscripts, and exhibits at Pilar Museum, gaining insights into the region's past.

	4. To enhance experiential learning by engaging in interactive
	discussions, hands-on activities, and reflections on agriculture,
	history, and heritage

	At Ela Farm, students observed organic compost creation, a sustainable
	practice that utilizes natural materials to produce nutrient-rich soil.
	Following this, the students walked through the farm's sugarcane fields,
	gaining insight into the cultivation process and learned about sugarcane
	cultivation from Ms. Saloni Patil. They also visited a Soil Testing
	Laboratory to understand soil analysis methods that guide fertilizer use.
	The trip included insights into the Entomology Department's work with
	honeybees, specifically the Apis cerana indica species and also with
	beneficial and non-beneficial pests.
	At GIPARD, the Director outlined the key objectives and discussed the
	Centre's commitment to excellence and effective governance through
	training and development programs.
	The visit to the Pilar Museum which housed a diverse collection of
	artifacts, relics and exhibits showcased the region's history, art and
	culture. Overall, the field trip was a rich and valuable experiential
	learning experience that reinforced the importance of sustainable and
	environmentally conscious farming methods. Students departed with an
	enhanced appreciation of agriculture developments, their position in
	food security and career prospects in advanced farming methods.
