Report	On 13th January 2025, a group of 18 students across the streams
	participated in a field trip to the Goa Science Center to attend the
	National Youth Day celebrations. The event was organized to inspire
	young minds and encourage self-discovery and personal growth.
	The session was chaired by the dynamic Mr. Kishore Shah, who
	delivered an engaging talk on the theme "RISE—Reinvent, Influence,
	Stabilize, Excel." His discussion revolved around unlocking hidden
	potential and focusing on strengths that often remain unnoticed. Mr.
	Shah emphasized the importance of self-awareness as a crucial step
	toward personal and professional growth.
	One of the key concepts Mr. Shah elaborated upon was the Johari
	Window, a psychological tool that helps individuals understand their
	relationships with themselves and others. He explained its four
	quadrants:
	Open Area: Known to self and others, representing shared
	knowledge and openness.
	2. Blind Spot: Known to others but not to oneself, highlighting
	areas where feedback can improve self-awareness.
	3. Hidden Area: Known to oneself but hidden from others,
	representing private thoughts and feelings.
	representing private triougnits and recilings.

	4. Unknown Area: Unknown to both self and others, signifying
	untapped potential and undiscovered traits.
	Mr. Shah's explanation encouraged the students to reflect on their
	own Johari Window, emphasizing the value of reducing blind spots
	through feedback and exploring the unknown quadrant by taking on
	new challenges.
	The session also underscored the significance of observation skills.
	To illustrate this, Mr. Shah screened a brief clip, encouraging
	participants to focus on details. Following the video, he engaged the
	audience in a series of questions to test their observation skills. This
	interactive activity not only captivated the participants but also
	highlighted the importance of mindfulness and attentiveness in daily
	life.
	The session was both thought-provoking and interactive, leaving the
	students inspired to explore their potential and enhance their self-
	awareness. Such enriching experiences underscore the value of field
	trips in complementing academic learning.
	The field trip to the Goa Science Center on National Youth Day provided valuable lessons for all who attended. The students were accompanied by Elvira Pereira, Asst. Prof. from the Department of Psychology.
