

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
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Principal's Message



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# TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAMME-IISC CHALLAKERE CAMPUS, KARNATAKA.

Recognising the need for science and mathematics teachers training, the I ndian Institute of Science (IISc), India's premier scientific institute took the initiative under the leadership of its Convenor, Prof. MS Hegde, CSIR Emeritus Scientist from the Solid State and Structural Chemistry Unit and began training schoolteachers locally. Eventually



this was expanded to include undergraduate and postgraduate college teachers, under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching.

Mr. Mahesh Nair and Mr. Clarence Rodrigues, Dept. of Chemistry, Mr. Gajanan Parab, Dept. of Mathematics and Mr. Sujay Naik, Dept. of Physics from St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, Goa attended the teachers training workshop conducted at the Talent Development Centre (TDC) of the IISc-Challakere Campus, Chittradurga, Karnataka from 25<sup>th</sup> October to 11<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

It is estimated that a college or university teacher in India directly teaches or influences 100-250 students per year. With the view that knowledge imparted to students by a teacher is proportional to the teacher's knowledge, teacher training programs at the TDC are highly intensive with a daily schedule of exercises, home assignments and regular testing, all aimed at maximising learning within a short period of time in a completely immersive environment totally devoid of any distractions.

The residential workshop consisted of both lecture and practical sessions based on learning by doing and experiential exercises. A variety of topics from different parts of the undergraduate syllabi were dealt with at a conceptual level. Sessions were engaged by scientists form various departments of IISc, all experts in their respective fields, involved in ongoing research, and on the cutting edge of science. Teaching learning sessions involved the introduction of novel strategies and new experiments specially designed to challenge thinking and clarify concepts.

The workshop was organised and coordinated by the Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Goa, for a group of approximately sixty teachers across different undergraduate colleges in Goa.



#### 4. RESEARCH COFFEE SERIES


#### 1. THE UNION BUDGET 2023 – AN ANALYSIS

As a part of the Research Coffee Series, various students from SYBA conducted research studies on various topics and presented the same in their classroom.

 $\operatorname{Mr.}$  Ruzario Sequeria and  $\operatorname{Mr.}$  Om Samant, both from SYBA spoke on the topic 'The

Union Budget 2023- An Analysis', on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2023. The Union Budget 2023-24 was presented on 1<sup>st</sup> February by the Finance Minister.

The students began their presentation by highlighting the key objectives of the Budget. The Budget aims at the overall development of the Indian Economy with respect to the global perspective. The Budget proposals for the 2023-24 financial year rest on envisioning a prosperous and inclusive India, in which the fruits of development reach all regions and citizens,



especially the youth, women, farmers, OBCs, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

The Budget 2023-24 adopts the following seven priorities. They complement each other and act as the 'Saptarishi' guiding the economy through the Amrit Kaal.

- 1. Inclusive Development
- 2. Reaching the Last Mile
- 3. Infrastructure and Investment
- 4. Unleashing the Potential
- 5. Green Growth
- 6. Youth Power



#### 7. Financial Sector

The students then continued their presentation by explaining the revenue and expenditure proposals of the Government for the current year as well as a comparison was made with last year's budget. The students also analysed the impact of the Budget on the different sectors of the economy like the agricultural sector, the industrial sector, the service sector with special emphasis on key areas of defence, education and health.

#### 2. The Rise and Fall of Hippo'

Ms. Christiana De Melo and Ms. Naomi Fernandes, both from SYBA presented on the topic 'The Rise and Fall of Hippo' on the 25th of September 2023.

Hippo is a product of Parle Agro which is led by Mr. Ramesh Chauhan. The journey of Hippo showcases the challenges and strategies involved in product development such as attractive packaging and intriguing flavours, in marketing such as innovative campaigns, and eventual market positioning.



Hippo was special, because of its unique flavours, vibrant packaging and amusing shapes. The students also spoke about how Hippo was received by the consumers. The thing that made people grab Hippo off the shelves was the novelty and variety, fun and playfulness that it offered, and popularity it garnered among the youth.

They proceeded to explain the marketing strategies used by Parle Agro to promote Hippo which was through campaigns like the 'Plan-T' campaign. The 'Plan-T' campaign involved making full and complete use of Twitter, a social media platform, as a cost-free alternative to reach out to all supply chains. Then came in the second campaign known as IFL, that is the Indian Food League. This was a campaign that brought cricket enthusiasts, belonging to different Indian cities together during the IPL (Indian Premier League). They asked fans to come up with innovative taglines regarding their staple food of their respective Indian cities. It was their responsibility to make the taglines as amusing as they possibly could. Winners were announced on a daily basis and were given adorable Hippo bean



bags. It is because of this campaign that the IPL received tremendous recognition and Hippo sales shot up.

They also explored other marketing strategies like Segmentation, Product positioning, Advertising and Promotion along with Tie-ups and Collaborations.

The students then explained to the class, how the same factors that led to Hippo's success led to its failure. The features that led to the rise and then demise of Hippo were Demand and Supply, Consumer Income and Preferences, Inflation and Pricing, Regulatory Environment and lastly, Market competition. Hippos greatest competitors that succeeded where Hippo failed were 'Bingo!', 'Kurkure', 'Lays', 'Too Yumm!' and 'Cornitos'.

They concluded by speaking about the lessons we could learn from Hippo's journey. The case of Hippo highlighted the importance of staying agile and remaining responsive to the unpredictable economic dynamics and consumer preferences to navigate challenges and sustain success in the ever-evolving marketplace.

Christiana and Naomi tried to keep the audience interested by making their presentation livelier with the help of memes, puns and Hippo's quirky advertisements all in one dramatic package.

#### 3. STOCK MARKET TRADING

A Research Coffee Series Lecture was conducted for the students of TY B. Com D on the 19/10/23. The Session was designed to bring together passionate individuals who were eager to delve into the stock markets. In the course of the event, there

was a remarkable line up of speakers, who gave insightful information. Throughout the session the speakers aimed at exploring various areas of the stock market and inspired insightful discussion through a demo of trading which broadened the understanding and perspective of the audience.

At the start Sanisha D'Silva welcomed the audience. Surya Parab then gave an overview of the stock market. Annalise Fernandes explained the various kinds



of equity and debt instruments. Vishwesh Gaaonkar provided in-depth knowledge of the derivatives market through a demo. He also showed how the students could utilise their savings productively by investing in these instruments as he is already into trading and gave some useful tips for the same. An open discussion followed with active participation by the students. Sakshi Goltekar summarised the session. Oshlena D'Souza than thanked the Department for giving the students such an opportunity. She also thanked the speakers for their efforts, the audience for the keen interest they showed in the topic and Santoshi Garudi for reporting writing.

#### SESSION ON ACADEMIC WRITING AND RESEARCH

A session on Academic Writing and Research was conducted for the students of TYBA English by the Department of English, St Xavier's College, Mapusa, Goa, on Thursday, 31st August 2023 in the language lab. The resource persons for the session consisted of Mrs. Alice D'Cruz and Dr. Leanora Madeira, from the Department of English. The talk was organised by the HOD, Dr. Prema Rocha.

She stressed on the title, introduction, and limitations. Dr. Leanora conducted the second half with a PowerPoint presentation, using MLA 9 as her guide, detailing the do's and dont's of citation, plagiarism, and consistency in a project. She also highlighted the format of references and bibliography.

At the end of the presentation, there was a brief QnA session where the students cleared their doubts regarding certain aspects of project requirements, and the teachers provided their input.

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#### **RESEARCH LECTURE ON MEMORY STUDIES**

Research empowers students to become lifelong learners and expand their knowledge

The Department of English of St. Xavier's College, was keen to introduce students to two key areas namely research and Goa . In this connection it was decided to organize a guest lecture ,on the 30th of September 2023 . This research initiative , took place at the PG Seminar Hall and featured Ms Rochelle Fernandes, an erudite research scholar, as the resource person. Her insightful lecture on the topic, "Memory Matters: Navigating Goan Recollections," garnered rapt attention and was well received.

The seminar commenced promptly at 10:10 am with a warm welcome extended to all attendees and dignitaries. Ms Amber Freitas, of the TYBA was host, and accorded a warm welcome to the gathering and the dignitaries, which included Ms Rochelle Fernandes, Dr. Prema Rocha, the Head of the Department, Ms. Shirlene Fernandes the event co-ordinator and the faculty members of the English Department. In her welcome address, Ms Amber emphasised the significance of research in academic pursuits.

Ms Anisha Mendonca, in her introduction, provided an overview of Ms Rochelle's illustrious background focussing on the fact that, she is an alumnus of St. Xavier's College and holds the honour of being crowned Ms. Xavier during her final year. She also served as the president of the Theatre Club and exhibited a passion for sports. She is currently working towards her PhD from BITS Pilani, Goa and completed four years of teaching at Dhempe College, Miramar. Furthermore, she has contributed significantly to the field of literature by editing works by acclaimed authors such as Lambert Mascarenhas' "Sorrowing Lies My Land". Her dedication to research is evident through her numerous presentations at both national and international levels.

As the formalities were completed the audience were glued to this dynamic young presenter who choose to provide a brief background of her topic under discussion. She outlined the presentation by dividing it into two comprehensive segments. In the first segment, she stressed on the importance of avoiding plagiarism and briefly touched on how to make a formal presentation of a research paper. Interestingly Ms Rochelle used Damodar Mauzo's short story, "These are My Children," as a template to arrive at various understandings of Goan Recollections . She delved into its major themes and demonstrated how various theories can be applied to analyse these themes effectively.



In the second segment, Ms Rochelle conducted an in-depth review of Memory Studies. She elucidated the different types of memories and how various physical spaces and objects can serve as sites of memory triggering different responses from different individuals. She also emphasised the importance of acknowledging the scope as well as the limitations when conducting a memory study and offered valuable insights for aspiring researchers. The stark black and white photograph display provided for a captivating end and spoke volumes of how memory gets played out as one witnesses different angles to understanding one simple picture.

The lecture concluded with an interactive Q&A session, allowing students to engage directly with Ms Rochelle Fernandes and seek clarification on various aspects of her presentation. 



# **DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY**

As the calendar turned to June 2023, the Department of Psychology commenced a transformative period marked by a series of impactful events.

On August 24th, our accomplished alumna, Ms. Carmisa Pereira, who recently completed her Master's studies in the UK in special education, delivered an inspirational orientation for TYBA students aspiring to pursue studies abroad. Organised by Fr. Ramiro Luis, the session provided practical insights into the challenges and triumphs of international education. Ms. Pereira's firsthand experiences and advice served as a valuable guide, fostering motivation and aspirations among the TYBA students.

On September 7, 2023, an insightful event on the "Awareness of Substance Abuse" took place at St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. Conducted by Ms. Elvira Pereira, Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology, the program aimed to educate students about the perils of substance abuse and promote a healthy, drug-free lifestyle. The event commenced with an opening address by Mr. Debojit Majumdar, emphasizing the importance of creating awareness about substance abuse. The program featured expert presentations, interactive discussions, and personal testimonials from individuals who have triumphed over substance abuse. The success of the event underscored the department's commitment to fostering awareness and understanding of substance abuse issues.

On September 8th, 2023, the students of TYBA psychology meticulously staged a play to commemorate the world suicide prevention day. The Play focused on the importance of seeking help in times of distress and also highlighted the importance of awareness and counselling services in promoting mental health. Miss Anuradha Kakodkar was the special guest for the program and was largely attended by several students of St Xavier's College, Mapusa Goa. The street play was coordinated by the head of the department, Professor Janet Fernandes and the College Counsellors.

A significant talk on "Sexual Harassment at Workplace" was organized on September 16, 2023, at St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. Coordinated by Ms. Elvira Pereira and Rev. Dr. Ramiro Luis, the talk featured Advocate and Notary Harsha Naik as the distinguished speaker. Advocate Naik, an esteemed alumnus, delivered an insightful discussion on various aspects of workplace harassment, shedding light on the legal framework, internal complaints committees, and the psychological dimensions of addressing this issue. The event, attended by students and faculty, exemplified the department's dedication to promoting safe and respectful work environments.



On October 12, 2023, Ms. Elvira Pereira, Assistant Professor from the Department of Psychology, conducted an engaging and educational activity titled "Guess the Disorder." This interactive session aimed to enhance students' understanding of various psychological disorders through a creative guessing game. Students from diverse streams participated, forming teams to analyze scenarios and identify corresponding disorders. The activity fostered a dynamic and collaborative learning atmosphere, reinforcing the department's commitment to destigmatizing mental health topics.

The department orchestrated a field visit to Central Jail, Colvale, on the 17th October. TYBA Psychology students from St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, were immersed in an eye-opening exploration of the rehabilitative aspects of the penal system. Coordinated by Ms. Anuradha Kakodkar, Associate Professor, Department of Psychology, the visit aimed to reshape students' perspectives on jails as reformative centers rather than purely punitive institutions. Beyond security checks, the students delved into the daily operations of the jail, witnessing the myriad facilities provided to inmates, from educational and vocational centers to medical facilities.

The department actively participated in a state-level seminar titled 'World Mental Health Day: Mental Health is a Universal Human Right.' Our department faculty, Dr. Eulalia Fernandes, along with five T.Y.B.A. Psychology Honours students, attended the one-day event organized by the Government College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Khandola – Marcela, Goa. Six engaging sessions, covering topics from emotional first aid training among youth to suicide prevention, were led by prominent professionals in the field. The seminar provided a platform for students to delve into the multifaceted aspects of mental health care, emphasizing the collaborative efforts required to address societal challenges.

On October 6, 2023, the department conducted a workshop on mental health for FYBA Psychology Major students in the laboratory. The workshop unfolded in two enlightening sessions. Ms. Aileen De Souza, representing the NGO Sethu, led the first session on 'Mental Health in Your Hands.' The session commenced with a unique ice-breaker exercise and a poignant video on the effects of stigma. Ms. De Souza's insights into coping with negative life events, maintaining healthy connections, and utilizing coping strategies resonated with the students. The second session, 'Caregiving,' was led by Ms. Chrissiedana Gomes from COOJ Mental Health Foundation. Through scenarios and role plays, students were sensitized to the nuances of providing care to individuals dealing with depression. The workshop was organised by Dr. Ubaldina Noronha.

The academic fervour continued with session under the Coffee Series initiated by the DHE, where final-year graduate students presented their research projects for

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the academic year 2023-24. On September 14, 2023 six diverse projects were unveiled, covering interesting topics of Psychological research. The faculty members provided insightful feedback, fostering an environment of scholarly growth and scientific temper. This was an initiative of Research and Development cell, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. Bi-Annual Research Series held on November 27, 2023 included Prof. Janet Dsouza, Ms. Anuradha Kakodkar, Dr. Eulalia Fernandes, and Dr. Ubaldina Noronha, who engaged in an interactive discussion on the selected paper 'The Impact of Workaholism on Nurses' Burnout and Disillusion.' The session delved into the study conducted in Sardinia, Italy, involving 614 nurses, unraveling the intricate relationship between workaholism and burnout. Faculty comments added depth to the session, culminating in the distribution of the insightful article.

On October 5th, 2023, the FYBA, FYBCom (SEC) Psychology students, staged an act on "Importance of Mental Health" for students of St. Xavier's College. On September 8, 2023, the same activity was conducted for the students of the St Xavier's higher secondary school at the Fr. Nicolau Pereira Amphitheatre of the St. Xavier's HSS.

On October 10th, 2023, the FY BA (SEC) students of Psychology participated in a full day, mental health programme organised by the South Goa District Hospital, Margao. The students displayed a meaningful medley of dance, skit, slogan, poem, and a pledge to commemorate the world mental health day. St. Xavier's College, Department of psychology had a display desk of selected psychological tests that are often used to screen depression, anxiety, stress, coping etc. The students were led under the leadership of the HOD, professor, Janet Fernandes.

In essence, the bi-annual report reflects the department's commitment to holistic education, community engagement, and scholarly pursuits. These events collectively contribute to the department's mission of nurturing well-rounded individuals equipped to address the multifaceted challenges of the contemporary world.



# REPORT ON THE FIRST SESSION OF THE BI-ANNUAL RESEARCH SERIES DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

The first interaction of the Bi-annual research series was held on 27<sup>th</sup> November 2023 at the Department of Psychology. A soft copy of the selected paper from The Open Psychology Journal, 2018, Volume 11, DOI:10.2174/18743501811010077, entitled 'The Impact of Workaholism on Nurses' Burnout and Disillusion' was emailed, at an earlier date to the faculty members of the department for reading and evaluation.

The faculty members present for the interactive session on  $27^{th}$  November 2023 was:

Prof. Janet Dsouza Ms. Anuradha Kadkodkar Dr. Eulalia Fernandes Dr. Ubaldina Noronha

A brief summary of the entire paper was first discussed by the faculty. The relevance of the paper was highlighted along with the technical soundness. The objectives of the paper were to contribute to the ongoing research on the relationship between workaholism and burnout among nurses, focusing specially on one particular dimension of disillusion, nursing being a helping profession.

The study was carried out in Sardinia, southern Italy, from 6 hospitals in that area. The sample size was fairly large at 614, including male and female nurses coming from a cross section of various departments of the hospital. The work experience of the nurses ranged from less than a year to over 21 years. Two self-report questionnaires were used, that is the Dutch Utrecht Workaholism Scale and the Link Burnout Questionnaire. The impact of workaholism on burnout was examined using the Structural Equation Model for each of the variables under the Link Burnout Questionnaire. The variables included Psychophysical exhaustion, relational deterioration, professional inefficacy and disillusion. Even two dimensions of Workaholism were examined separately, that is Working Compulsively and Working Excessively.

Analysis of the responses linked working compulsively and working excessively to disillusion. Further working excessively also impacted psychophysical exhaustion. Correlations among the rest of the variables were relatively low. More than 26% of the nurses are affected by burnout, whereas 21% are workaholics. Working excessively is a better predictor of psychophysical exhaustion and disillusion. It can be concluded that nurses are at risk of workaholism and burnout.

After comments from the faculty, the session came to an end. A copy of the article accompanies this report.

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# **REPORT OF THE WORKSHOP ON MENTAL HEALTH**


A workshop on mental health was conducted on the  $6^{th}$  of October 2023 for the students of FYBA Psychology Major in the laboratory. The resource persons were welcomed with a potted plant. Then in two separate but successive session, they educated the students on the importance of mental health.

The first session was conducted by Ms. Aileen De Souza, from Sethu, an NGO dealing with child guidance. She spoke on the topic 'Mental Health in your hands'. We started the session with a ice-breaker exercise wherein we were given the task of picking chits and forming groups according to the name of the instrument on the chit. A video on the effects of stigma was shown and we were told to note down the points that we observed and also other factors that potentially affect mental health. The inputs given by the students were then discussed. The speaker then enlightened us on mental health and how to cope with negative events of life. The importance of taking care of our bodies, maintaining healthy connections, using coping strategies and emphasizing our strengths as a way to improve our mental health was also introduced to us. Coping strategies like mindfulness jar and daily planner were demonstrated to us.

The second session was conducted by Ms. Chrissiedana Gomes from COOJ Mental Health foundation on the topic 'Caregiving'. We were informed on the differences between mental health and mental illness. Different scenarios were given where the students had to identify ways to provide care to a person who is suffering from depression. Ways to provide care like learning about the illnesses, watch out for signs, seeking professional help and taking care of oneself were also shared with us. The importance of effective listening and communication in caregiving was also emphasized by role plays involving the students. The roleplays brought out the ideal and as well as inefficient ways of communication when a person wants to speak about their difficulties.

The workshop came to a fruitful conclusion with the presentation of tokens by the Head of Department, Prof. Janet DeSouza and a vote of thanks. Dr. Eulalia Fernandes and Dr. Ubaldina Noronha organised the entire programme with help of student volunteers of the class. Around 36 students attended the workshop.





# WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY: MENTAL HEALTH IS A UNIVERSAL HUMAN RIGHT.

Dr. Eulalia Fernandes, along with five students; Krislyn D'souza, Monoshka Coelho, Nehajoyce, Sarah Fernandes and Elysia Luis, of the T.Y.B.A. Psychology Honours class, participated in the One-day State level seminar on the theme, 'World Mental Health Day: Mental Health is a Universal Human Right', organized by Government College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Khandola – Marcela, Goa in collaboration with Rotary Club of Panaji Mid-Town on the 12<sup>th</sup> of October from 09:30 a.m. to 06:00 p.m. , held at Sanskruti Bhavan, Patto, Panjim – Goa. The 6 interesting sessions of the seminar aimed to raise awareness of mental health issues and mobilize efforts in support of mental health.

The first session titled 'Importance of Emotional First Aid Training among Youth' was conducted by Prof. Mahesh Pai, Principal, Goa College of Home Science. He highlighted the 7 common psychological injuries: rejection, failure, loneliness, loss/grief, rumination, guilt and low self-esteem. Prof. Pai explained ways to heal these psychological injuries.

The next session on 'Addiction among Youth' was delivered by Mr. Debojit Majumdar, Sr. Consultant, Kripa Foundation. He spoke about addiction as a brain based disorder. The resource person for the third session on 'Countering Violence and Ensuring Wellbeing in Intimate Relationships' was Ms. Devika Gupta, Research Coordinator, Sangath, Goa. She explained the different types of violence – physical, sexual, and emotional and the mental health effects of violence. Ms. Gupta also mentioned the steps to be taken to curb this issue.


Dr. Nandita de Souza, Director & Developmental & Behavioural Paediatrician, Sethu Goa, presented the fourth session 'Being an Ally: Ensuring Developmental and Behavioural Wellbeing among Youth with Disabilities'. She enlightened the audience about the challenges faced by neurodivergent individuals. The fifth session was conducted by Dr. Peter Castelino, Psychiatrist & Director, Cooj- Mental Health Foundation, on a very important topic – 'Suicide Prevention among Youth'.

Dr. Castelino read out the statistics of suicide rates globally as well as in India. He explained what drives someone to suicide and how one can recognize the warning signs, assess suicide risk, and create a safety plan for these individuals. Ms. Juliana Lohar, Coordinator, ARZ, conducted the final session titled 'Assuring Mental Health for Victims of Trauma and Abuse'. Victims of abuse require to be rescued, provided



with justice and protection, the psychological impacts on them need to be addressed and they need to be reintegrated back into society.

The seminar was enlightening as it focussed on the work done by mental health professionals and threw light on what more needs to be done to make mental health care a reality for all.



# PURSUING STUDIES ABROAD

On the 24th of August 2023, an enriching and inspiring session unfolded at our institution as Ms. Carmisa Pereira, an esteemed alumna, shared her experiences and insights after successfully completing her Master's studies in special education. The focus of the session was to guide and inspire TYBA students aspiring to pursue higher education abroad. This invaluable orientation aimed to provide a roadmap for those contemplating university studies beyond national borders.

The session, moderated by Fr. Ramiro Luis, served as a platform for Ms. Pereira to share her academic journey, challenges faced, and triumphs achieved during her pursuit of higher education in special education. Her firsthand experiences, coupled with practical advice, offered TYBA students a unique perspective on the possibilities and intricacies of studying abroad.



The students received the third place for Millet Cooking Competition. The students were accompanied by Dr. Seema Fernandes.

The SEC Botany students of class F.Y. B.Sc./B.A./B. Com visited Mr. Farmer Nursery at Guirim, Mapusa on  $27^{th}/29^{th}/30^{th}$  September 2023. Students got an opportunity to observe landscape designing, nursery layout of different types of plant arrangements, vertical gardens, green walls, rooftop gardens, ponds & water gardens. 

ii) Kaiga Atomic Power station, Karwar, Karnataka.






A window into the realm of art and understanding

On July 31, students from TYBA Mass Communication and Journalism at St. Xavier's College visited the Goa Legislative Assembly in Porvorim. They had an opportunity to observe a two-hour session and interact with the Deputy Speaker and MLA Joshua D'souza, Opposition Leader Yuri Alemao, and Fatorda MLA Vijay Sardesai.

The assembly session began promptly at 11:30 a.m. During the question hour, MLAs raised queries from the previous session, which proceeded smoothly. However, the atmosphere shifted dramatically during the zero hour when members of the opposition, dressed in somber black attire, stood up abruptly. They chanted slogans and held placards addressing the Manipur issue until their microphones were silenced.

Seven opposition members continued their protest, marching towards the well of the house. Despite attempts from the speaker and the house to suppress the disruption, they interrupted the member addressing the assembly, Jit Arolkar. Subsequently, the opposition members were escorted out by the marshals, and Speaker Ramesh Tawadkar imposed a two-day suspension, which was later reduced to 24 hours.

In conversations with both sides, Fatorda MLA Vijay Sardesai and Opposition Leader Yuri Alemao defended the protest as necessary, stating that the topic was chosen through a ballot system but was subsequently disregarded by the speaker. On the other hand, Deputy Speaker Joshua D'souza believed the suspension was an essential response to the situation.

The planned visit turned out to be fortuitous for the students as they witnessed a turn of event in the assembly. Jadyn Pereira, a TYBA Journalism student, expressed, "The assembly visit was undoubtedly one of the most exceptional field visits during our entire three-year tenure. It felt like we were part of something truly remarkable, and personally, I was pleasantly overwhelmed by how the visit surpassed my expectations."

Anushka Essani, another student from TYBA Mass Communication, appreciated the insights into the functioning of the lower house, stating, "Every citizen should attend an assembly session at least once to understand the workings of the government and its engagement with the citizens."



On July 31, the students of TYBA Mass Communication and Journalism of St. Xavier's College went on a field visit to the Goa Legislative Assembly, Porvorim. They began shouting out slogans holding placards of the Manipur issue until their mics were turned off. In a brave move, the seven members pulled out slogans and paraded towards the well of the house. When the speaker and house began to shut them down, they proceeded to interrupt the member speaking; Jit Arolkar. The opposition were then escorted out by the marshals. Speaker Ramesh Tawadkar suspended them for two days, later which was reduced to 24 hours.

Speaking to both the sides, the opposition party, Fatorda MLA Vijay Sardesai and Opposition Leader Yuri Alemao, believed the move was necessary as the topic was chosen in the ballot system but the speaker sidelined it. The Deputy Speaker Joshua D'souzasaid the suspension was the need of the hour.

A planned visit turned out to be lucky for us students to witness exclusive parliamentary behavior. "The assembly visit was hands down one of the best field visits of the entire three year tenure so far. It felt like we were part of something truly spectacular and on a personal note, I was pleasantly overwhelmed with how the visit exceeded my expectations," said Jadyn Pereira, student of TYBAJournalism. Another student Anushka Essani from TYBAMass Communication said it was nice to see the functioning of the lower house. 






world contexts, deepening their understanding of human behavior, cultural dynamics, and societal norms.

## Report on REBOUND 3.0: Fostering Unity through Sports and Parish Linkages






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Mr. Milton Fernandes, ex-director of sports at Goa University, served as the chief guest, adding significance to the event with his words of appreciation and encouragement.


REBOUND 3.0, highlighted the unifying power of sports and showcased the profound impact of organized sports on community spirit and unity.

who regaled the audience with melodious Konkani music.






### **SPARK CLUB**



## 'IN MEMORIAM'



# Ph.D AWARD

Dr Shefali Kale, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Philosophy defended her doctoral thesis on 7<sup>th</sup> November, 2023 at Goa University. She completed her PhD in Philosophy, titled "Women and Religion : A Study in Feminist Philosophy", under the guidance of Prof. Koshy Tharakan, Dean, School of Sanskrit, Philosophy and Indic Studies, Goa University.

The objective of the study titled, 'Religion and Women: A Study in Feminist Philosophy', was to explore the attitudes of major and minor religions of the East and West towards women. Secondly by employing the conceptual structures of feminist philosophy, it sought to uncover the prejudices perpetuated by patriarchy against women in religions. The study was based on the hypothesis that religion acts as one of the societal structures which has played a pivotal role in suppressing and dehumanizing women. The methodology used was standpoint feminist methodology. The findings are, traditionally religion acts as an agent of oppression for women because the major religions are patriarchal. Women learn about themselves from the religious scriptures which were written/interpreted by men. Modes of knowledge which are male-centered have led to misconceptions and prejudices about women. Women thus need an epistemological framework which makes them the subject of study, which is provided by the feminist standpoint theory.


#### 5. <u>Millets stall at the celebration of Goenchi Asmitai Day -18<sup>th</sup> October, 2023</u>


#### **REPORT ON ANNUAL BOOK EXHIBITION**


#### **REPORT DISPLAY ON CHANDRAYAAN 3**





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

# 33) PREAMBLE PLEDGE


On the occasion of NCC day Preamble pledge was taken by the NCC cadets on 26/11/2023. All cadets of NCC boys unit took the pledge.
