The event commenced at 9.30. am at the Xavier's Ark. The Chief Guest was welcomed at the Institution by the Administrator of the College Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema, Principal Prof. (Dr). Blanche Mascarenhas, Vice Principals Mrs. Ursula Barreto and Mrs. Sandra Fernandes, Chairperson of the PTA Mrs. Patricia D'Souza and the General Secretary of the Students Council Mr. Anuj Naik.

St. Xavier's College had its 58th Annual Sports meet for the academic year 2023-24 on Saturday, the 24th of February 2024 on the College Football ground. The Chief Guest for the event was an alumnus of the College, Mr. Tushar Lotlikar, Police Inspector, Ponda Police Station, Goa. Upon his arrival the Chief Guest was welcomed by the Principal, Prof. Dr. Blanche Mascarenhas; the Administrator, Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema; the Vice Principals, Ms. Ursula Barreto and Ms. Sandra Fernandes; the Director of Physical Education of the College, Ms. Joslyn D'Souza, the Instructors in Physical Education, Ms. Astrid Pereira and Mr. Roger Fernandes, and the esteemed members of the faculty. The Chairperson of the St. Xavier's College PTA, Ms. Patricia D'Souza was also present at the Meet.



In his welcome address, the Administrator, Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema expressed great joy at having Chief Guest, Ponda PS PI Tushar Lotlikar, to his alma mater. Fr Antonio highlighted the fact that the college has excelled and emerged victorious in sports under the guidance of Ms. Joslyn D'Souza, ably aided by the sports instructors Ms. Astrid Pereira and Mr. Roger Fernandes. He stated that the sports meet was a time to celebrate achievements, wins and losses, joys and tears, and knowing that participation has not only brought laurels but also boosted health and promoted camaraderie among sportspersons. In her address, Principal Prof. Dr. Blanche Mascarenhas underlined that education is not merely academics, but wholistic development of a student. While many find it difficult to balance academics and sports, Prof. Dr. Blanche Mascarenhas pointed out that the Chief Guest excelled at both academics and sports, while he was a student, and has become a valuable government official in public administration.

This was followed by an impressive marching display by the students of the College. The Chief

Guest and the Principal took the salute. The Parade Commander of the march past was Senior Under Officer, Mr. Shresth Fadte, an NCC Cadet who has always shown exceptional dedication, and devotion in leadership, discipline and community service at NCC, besides having been a member of the marching contingent at the 2024 Republic Day Parade at Rajpath, New Delhi.



The march past was followed by the torch relay. The torchbearers for the day were our sportspersons Ms. Keona Rajani, an SYBA student, a Kiteboarding gold winner at the national level; Ms. Doris Goves, an FYBSc student, a gold medal winning sportsperson at athletics and other sports; Ms. Sukanya Naik, an SYBCom student, a bronze medallist at Lagori; and Ms. Chanel Crizzle, an FYBA Mass Comm student, a member of the Indian Rugby contingent. They all carried the torch onto the sports ground and handed it to the Chief Guest and later lit the Games

torch. The sportsman's oath was then recited by Mr. Harsh Bhagat (SYBSc), followed by the sportsman's prayer recited by Ms. Richa Gawade (SYBA). At this juncture, the Chief Guest formally declared the 58th Annual Sports Meet open. The opening of the sports meet was also marked with a release of balloons in the colours of the national flag.

Speaking of the impressive achievements of the College sportspersons, the Director of Physical Education of the College, Ms. Joslyn D'Souza, in her Sports report, informed the gathering that St. Xavier's college was awarded the best college in sports for the year 2022-23 and that the College remains on course to take the coveted award yet again, for the current academic year, as the college has bagged the first place in women's table tennis, women's volleyball, women's basketball, men's handball, hockey in both categories and men's powerlifting. The women's football team, women's swimming team, men's basketball team and women's basketball team finished second this year, while the women's bagged third place in athletics, and the men's swimming team also finished in the same position. Listing out the moments of glory, Ms. Joslyn D'Souza read out the list of the sports stars that have won accolades at the international and national level.

The Chief Guest, Ponda PI Mr. Tushar Lotlikar, expressed his pleasure at being present as a chief guest at his alma mater. PI Mr. Tushar reminisced about his days as a sports person at Xavier's HSS and College where he excelled in athletics and football. He thanked the sports directors of that era as well as the teachers for supporting sportspersons. PI Tushar also offered pearls of wisdom to the students in attendance, "I would like to remind the students that sports is not only about winning or losing, but participation is more important. With sports, you become fitter, you become more healthier, and you become leaders in the future."

The student sportspersons from the College who participated in the National Games 2023 were felicitated at the hands of the Principal. The management prizes were then presented at the hands of the Chief Guest. The late P.V. Tharakan award given to an all-rounder in different modalities of sports was given to Mr. Nathan D'Souza (TYBCA). The Mr. Clyde Dias Sports Prizes given to students with best performance in sports was secured by Mr. Kaushik Sakhalkar (TYBA), Mr. Sohit Naik (TYBCom) and Ms. Chrisann Noronha (TYBCA). The Best Sportsman 2023-24

award went to Mr. Sohan Naik (TYBCom) and the Best Sportswoman 2023-24 award was won by Ms. Anoshka D'Souza (TYBCom). The Best Athlete (Men) was won by Mr. Maven Santiago (SYBA) and Best Athlete (Women) was secured by Ms. Chanel Crizzle (FYBA Mass Comm). Students who participated in various national level competitions were also felicitated.

The Sports Meet saw various sprint events, drills and cheering squads performing for the benefit of all. The Vote of Thanks was given by the Sports Secretary Mr. Fluino Carvalho. The College Sports Flag was then lowered by the NCC Cadets. It was folded by them and handed over to the Principal. The Principal, then, handed it over to the Sports Director for safekeeping, till the next College Sports meet. The event concluded with the singing of the national anthem.

The Faculty Enrichment Program was attended by 174 Faculty members, 126 were from the teaching faculty and 48 were from the non-teaching faculty of St. Xavier's College.

newer approaches and better instrumental technologies for contributing towards the advancement of science.

XAVIER'S OPEN LAB DAY



As part of the National Science Day celebrations, the Science Faculty of St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, organised "Xavier's Open Lab Day" on 28th February, 2024 under the DBT STAR College Scheme to promote scientific curiosity among school students. A brief inaugural ceremony was held at the Science Block of the College wherein the event was declared open by the Administrator Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema, in the presence of the Vice Principal & Convenor of the Programme Ms Ursula Barreto, the Coordinator of the Star College Scheme Dr. Trelita de Sousa, faculty members and

students of the college. The event witnessed an impressive turnout, with over 400 school students from across Goa visiting the campus. Several activities including quiz, scientific games, experiments, models, and exhibits were arranged by each of the 8 science departments of the college covering topics of different interests in the field of science.

School students were seen engrossed in lab activities and were most excited to learn about the experiments on display like, Newtons rings, Surface Tension of water and soap solution by Capillary rise method, Demonstration of waveforms using CRO, Fizzy Potions, Changing Water to



Wine, Golden rain, Electronic Dice, Vehicle parking system using RFID, Intruder Alarm, Exploration of plant life such as Seaweeds, Biodiversity and conservation efforts, Plant Tissue culture, Advances in Biotechnology, Fingerprint Analysis, Blood grouping, Microorganisms on the human body, Effect of antibiotics on bacteria, Fermented drink – Kanji, Voice recognition using ML and AI, Visual guardian App for visually impaired persons using ML and NLP, Line Follower robot, Puzzle solving and card games, Mathematics involved in tricks, and Mathematics in everyday life.



The Xavier's Open Lab Day, provided a dynamic platform for students to immerse themselves in the fascinating world of science and technology. The event successfully fostered a

spirit of curiosity, innovation, and collaboration among participants, reaffirming the college's commitment to promoting scientific literacy and excellence in education.

One of the highlights of the event was the Science "Super-Hero" Competition, wherein students of the college from each department showcased their creativity by designing mascots representing their respective fields of study. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

ECOFIESTA 2.0

RESEARCH COFFEE SERIES

1. **AARISH- NATURAL PRODUCTS FOR A HEALTHY LIFE** The presentation on 'AARISH- Natural products for a healthy life' was done by Ms. Aanchal Parwar and Ms. Rishwa Divker from Syba, on the 8th of Jan 2024. AARISH natural products are made up of 100 percent natural ingredients without the use of any artificial chemical products. The source of the products are plants or vegetables, and it is traditionally made at home. The products



are a catalyst for a thriving community that embraces the magic of simplicity and mother nature. The students explained the procedure of making two products - Lip balm and Hair oil. The students also explained the multiple uses of the papaya fruit, particularly its impact on the skin.

2. NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY

Ms. Devyani Kudnekar and Ms. Rudraksha Raul both from SYBA delivered a comprehensive presentation on the New National Education Policy on February 12, 2024. The presentation aimed to elucidate the key features, implications, and conclusions of the NEP.

Key Features were:

1. Introduction of the NEP and its significance in the Indian education landscape.
2. Structural reforms proposed under the NEP, with emphasis on early childhood care and education, foundational literacy, and numeracy.
3. Highlighting the flexibility and multidisciplinary approach promoted by the NEP.
4. Integration of technology and digital resources in education.
5. Strategies for improving the quality of teachers and teaching methods.
6. Emphasis on vocational education, skill development, and lifelong learning.



The presentation concluded with a call to action, urging stakeholders to actively participate in the implementation of the NEP and contribute towards shaping the future of education in India. Devyani Kudnekar and Rudraksha Raul emphasized the need for collaboration among policymakers, educators, parents, and students to realize the vision outlined in the NEP.


3. Workshop on Translation

On a rocky laterite bed, students could view an archive of human and animal figures like the humped Zebu bull, antelopes, deer, fox, a deer and a bull locking horns, animal hoofs, a female figure, probably a mother goddess symbol of the fertility cult, and another human figure etched in a dancing pose. The trail of Netravali through the lush-green Netravali Wild Life Sanctuary provided an enriching experience of tangible and intangible heritage through a mud track road and scenic pathway. Students and teachers were entertained by the sounds of birds and buzzing bees. The cascading Sawari Waterfall, nestled in



the Sanctuary helped everyone to spend some leisurely moments in its cool waters. The Sati stones of Cotombi helped the viewers to connect with the medieval rituals practiced in Goa. 

Summer Internship Programme

The Summer Internship Programme at Kripa Foundation, Anjuna, held from May 18 to June 18, 2023, provided 32 Psychology students with practical exposure to drug de-addiction. Coordinated by Elvira Pereira, Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology, the program offered hands-on experience in detoxification, counseling, and behavioral therapies. Students observed the medical detoxification process, attended counseling sessions, and learned about Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) and Motivational Interviewing (MI). They also participated in group sharing sessions, facilitated discussions, and engaged in complementary activities like yoga, meditation, and seminars on addiction and mental health. The program significantly enriched students' personal and professional growth, providing valuable real-world experience.



Departmental Meetings

To ensure the common shared goals of the department and enhance the teaching-learning experience for students, departmental meetings are held regularly. These meetings facilitate coordination, planning, and the continuous improvement of educational strategies within the Department of Psychology.



DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

Field Trip

The Department of Sociology organised a **field trip** on 4th February 2024 to three spots of socio-cultural significance. Sixty students visited the Usgalimol Petroglyphs on the banks of river Kushavati in Rivona, Sanguem taluka. The Petroglyphs are considered to be approximately 10,000 years old depicting figures of various animals, carved animal footprints, probably Mother Goddess symbols, fertility symbols – the petroglyphs gave the students a glimpse into millennia old human activity. Pantaleao Fernandes, an avid photographer, author and ethnographer, accompanied the group as a resource person. He threw light on the possible meanings of the petroglyphs, their time-line and the history of their discovery.



The students visited two Sati stones next. Sati stones are found across the state and mark the patriarchal practise of widows requiring them to immolate themselves on their husband's funeral pyre. The next stop was at the Buddhist caves in Rivona where the students learned of the Buddhist presence in the region. The students were accompanied by Prof. Afonso

Botelho, Head of Department of Sociology and Asst. Prof. Freda Tavares.

Debate

Ms Elizabeth Bara organised a **debate on the topic 'Should Marital Rape be Criminalised?'** The SYBA students who had opted for this paper on 'Gender and Violence' participated in the same which was held in March 2024.

Public Speaking Skills Workshop

The students of SYBA who were offered the paper titled Corporate Interpersonal Skills were provided an opportunity to enhance their **public speaking** skills through an activity which required them to speak on various topics for a duration of one minute. The same students were also involved in a group activity wherein they were provided different scenarios at workplace. They were required to discern the type of discrimination and its impact on the individual and society.

Gender and Society: Some Emerging Issues

The TYBA students of '**Gender and Society: Some Emerging Issues**' analysed advertisements appearing in different print and broadcast media to understand the gender stereotypes prevalent in the society and consequent forms of violence caused by such portrayal. A movie 'Provoked' was also screened and watched jointly by SY and TY students which made the students aware of the types and intensity of violence against women. 'Admitted', a biopic on transgender individual was screened to help the students understand their struggles and violence they face due to their identity.

Prof. Afonso Botelho, Professor and HOD, availed of the Sabbatical Leave available to the teachers of the Colleges and did research on the village of Betalbatim. At the end of the year-long Leave he published a book on '**Emigration, Tourism, In-migration and Occupational Diversification in Betalbatim, Goa.**

The students Sociology were declared Runners-up at the one-day state level inter-collegiate event '**Sociofiesta**' on 16th February 2024. The theme was 'Rethinking Tomorrow: Crisis of the 21st Century and the Way Forward,' which helped the students to analyze, discuss, and express views on contemporary issues. The students were accompanied by Prof. Afonso Botelho.



DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

A fieldtrip was conducted on 27 February 2024 by the Department of Geography under the guidance of Dr. DadapirJakat for the students of S.Y.B.A ,GE-Geography students in coordination with the Forest Department of Goa. Consent forms were signed by every student attending the fieldtrip. A student committee was formed to take care of snacks and beverages , discipline and to keep a head count of every individual. The students were asked to assemble at the Gandhi Circle – Mapusa Bus Stand at 8.00 a.m. The journey began at 8.30 a.m. The places visited are as follows:-

Khandepar Pandava Caves

Situated on the banks of river Khandepar in Goa , Khandepar Caves are a group of free standing caves cut with rocks. These rock cut caves are dated back to 10th and 11th century , when it's constructional style was just structural. One of the finest rock cut sanctuaries in Goa , Khandepar Caves boast of three exquisite cave structures which are similar in



pattern and carved from a single block. These are among the oldest treasures of Goa which was rediscovered in 1970.

Shree Kapileshwar Daevasthan

The main temple of Ponda, Kapileshwar Temple is dedicated to “the destroyer” from the Hindu holy trinity -Lord Rudra / Shiva. This temple was built in the 18th century. This place has a peaceful aura. The prominent feature of its courtyard is the small alter adorned with Tulsi plant (basil) which is considered very auspicious in the Hindi scriptures. On one side of the courtyard steps lead to a water tank whose still green waters speak of the history that has been witnessed. Legends say this is the birthplace of sage Kapila who was an acclaimed sage in the Hindu Mythology.



Safa Masjid

Built by Ibrahim Ali Adil Shah in 1560 A.D. Safa Masjid is situated in Ponda Taluka. It is rectangular in shape and consists of a water tank in the south. The water tank has natural springs. It consists of six flights of stairs all around it. The mosque is built of locally available laterite stone. It has a triple arched façade. Externally it has arches on all the four sides. The mosque is relatively small and consists of a single prayer hall with no columns. At present the tank is used for ablution as well as a community well and a resting space.



Mollem National Park and Bhagwan Mahaveer Sanctuary

This area was initially known as the Mollem Game Sanctuary and later in 1969, it came to be referred as a Wildlife Sanctuary while the core region of this park came to be addressed as the Bhagwan Mahaveer Sanctuary. This core area covers 107 kms of area and the whole area along with other circle of the park, combined to be known as the Mollem national Park in the year 1978. With a huge area replete with lush greenery, the Park houses a variety of plants, trees, bushes and flowers, some of which are highly popular and also have remedial or medicinal qualities. It is actually a Tropical Evergreen forest of the West Coast of India and has some Moist Deciduous plants as well. The region homes a variety of mammals, birds, a



huge variety of colorful and bright butterflies and some dangerous reptiles as well. The area also has a beautiful waterfall referred to as “Dudhsagar Falls,” meaning the Sea of Milk. The waterfall got its name from the foamy white water that falls as a result of the force of the height.

The students visited all the places and were given a break of one hour to have lunch and rest followed by a small trek at the Mollem National Park where they were accompanied by two guides from the Forest Department of Goa.

Cosmeceuticals are cosmetic products that claim to have medicinal or drug-like benefits due to their active ingredients. At the facility, the students on arrival were welcomed by Dr. Supriya Hyam, R & D Manager and then taken inside the storage warehouse to show the raw material storage and weighing. Later they were sectioned into groups and taken inside the processing unit where the tablet formulation was shown. Following that the students were taken to the QC labs where first in the chemistry section the students were demonstrated the essential oil extraction on small scale using fractional distillatory. Further in the Biology section they were demonstrated and explained the process of identification of the purity and quality of the extracted essential oil using HPTLC and matching it with the data in Ayurvedic pharmacopeia. 



Intercollegiate Quiz Competition organized by ACT at Goa University

Skit – National Science Day Programme 2024


The department of Electronics in collaboration with DBT and the other science departments organized the Skit, titled, "Science for a Sustainable future" on 1st March, 2024 on the occasion






Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum Bangalore

The purpose of the visit was to familiarize the students with the advanced instrumentation and research environment provided by CSIF. This dedicated facility was established to bolster the university's research efforts,

During the visit, CSIF staff elucidated the working principles and applications of these instruments, enriching the students'

launched international quality craft beers both for the domestic and international markets. On arrival, we were welcomed by Dr. Dhaval Patel and were served with a welcome cold brewed sparkling iced tea of different flavors. Dr. Patel gave us an overview of the tour. He also

explained to us the general working plant, fermentation and production of beer. Maka Di manufactures varieties of beer such as Belgian Blanche, Bavarian Keller, Belgian Tripel, Honey Ale etc. The visit commenced to various areas of the brewery plant i.e. right from the raw material section to packaging of the products. Mr. Santosh highlighted the importance of water in crafting the beers as per the tastes of clients from India, Europe, America etc. Next, he explained the



importance is choosing the right material for beer production i.e. Barley. He showed us the malt houses when barley is germinated under controlled conditions and the quality tests done to check the sugar content in them and provided an insight into the interior of the fermenters where the production was halted, for better understanding of the construction. The trip ended with a question answer session, where the brew master Dr. Dhaval Patel and students interacted.

TALK ON CHEMICAL SENSING USING RAMAN SPECTROSCOPY



The students were enlightened on the five types of Disabilities as per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 which were as follows: (i) Physical disabilities (Locomotor, visual, Hearing, speech disability), (ii) Intellectual Disability (specific-dyslexia, autism) (iii) Mental Illness (iv) Disability caused due to neurological conditions or blood disorders (v) Multiple Disabilities. Further, the students were sensitized on how to speak to persons with Disability with empathy and ways in which they can be supportive towards them on campus as well as in public.

The Fourth Mentoring session was held on 27th February 2024 on the topic “Good Manners and Understanding the Art of Netiquettes”. In the world of social media, where interactions in the virtual space define the personality of a person, understanding good behavior on the internet is very crucial. The session began with mentors discussing the area- Ten Commandments on Good Manners; which summarized good manners that a person should portray in society. Some of these include: Being Yourself, saying Thank You, Not be Boastful, listening before speaking, Interacting with kindness & caution etc. With regards to understanding Netiquettes, the session focused on rules adapted from “*Virginia Shea's : The Core Rules of Netiquette*” These rules include: Remember the Human, adhere to standards online as one would follow in real life, respect other people's time & bandwidth, respect people's privacy etc.

The Fifth Session was on the theme “Awareness on Anti-ragging and Understanding the Power of Empathy”. In the first part of the session, mentors were requested to sensitize students on Anti-Ragging and students were asked to fill the Anti-Ragging Undertaking present on the college website. This activity was an initiative of the Anti-Ragging Committee of the college. Further, the students were drawn toward understanding the power of Empathy. Empathy is the ability to understand and share the feelings, emotions and perspectives of others. It involves putting yourself in someone else's shoes and seeing the world from their point of view. Further, comparing it with sympathy which means to feel sorry for someone's situation or offer pity; empathy covers a broader spectrum where one shares the feeling and emotions of another person on a more deeper level. Finally students were urged to cultivate empathy in their behaviour by active listening, respecting differences, showing kindness and compassion etc.

a) Session on “Resume Writing and Facing Interviews”

The cell conducted a session on the 30th of March 2024 at 12:45 p.m. for final year students (UG and PG), with the intention of equipping students with the necessary skills and knowledge to excel in their upcoming interviews. The resource person for the session was Mr. Rommel Pinheiro, Assistant Professor in the BBA (T&T) Department of the college.

He spoke on the difference between a Curriculum Vitae (CV) and a Resume and then proceeded to educate the students on the primary rules and strategies of drafting a resume as a fresher, providing examples and highlighting what content to include or avoid. Additionally, he informed the students about what the industry looks for in potential candidates and how students can align themselves with industry requirements.

Furthermore, he emphasized the importance of researching a company before attending an interview and provided insights on handling Applicant Tracking Systems (ATS).

Mr. Pinheiro explained the significance of interviews, gave a few pre-interview preparation tips, and rules to follow during an interview; he also briefly touched on the types of questions typically asked, and how to respond effectively. He concluded the session by addressing the students' queries.

PH.D AWARD

Dr Shefali Kale, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Philosophy defended her doctoral thesis on 7th November, 2023 at Goa University. She completed her PhD in Philosophy, titled “Women and



Religion: A Study in Feminist Philosophy”, under the guidance of Prof. Koshy Tharakan, Dean, School of Sanskrit, Philosophy and Indic Studies, Goa University.

The objective of the study was to explore the attitudes of major and minor religions of the East and West towards women. Secondly by employing the conceptual structures of feminist philosophy, it sought to uncover the prejudices perpetuated by patriarchy against women in religions. The study was based on the hypothesis that religion acts as one of the societal structures which has played a pivotal role in suppressing and dehumanizing women. The methodology used was standpoint feminist methodology. The findings are, traditionally religion acts as an agent of oppression for women because the major religions are patriarchal. Women learn about themselves from the religious scriptures which were written/interpreted by men. Modes of knowledge which are male-centered have led to misconceptions and prejudices about women. Women thus need an epistemological framework which makes them the subject of study, which is provided by the feminist standpoint theory.




The program was initiated with the lighting of the traditional lamp followed by a floral tribute to Swami Vivekananda's portrait, the great

Actizen Collective Project, Desh Apnayen: 5th December 2023 to 30th January 2024

The collaboration between the NSS unit of Goa and Desh Apnayen Foundation brought forth the Actizens Collective Project, a beacon of hope for students who are not only eager to tackle civic



issues but also aspire to become active citizens and positive change makers. Under the project, teams had to identify 5 civic issues in their locality by surveying with locals and then select 1 issue to be solved. Then do research to understand locals views, reasons behind the problem, and collaborate with the government to implement effective solutions, aiming to make a positive change.

Through a meticulous process, the team from St. Xavier's college

Under the leadership & guidance of Principal: Prof. (Dr.) Blanche Mascarenhas, Administrator: Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema & NSS Programme Officer: Dr. Rheane Da Silva. The Actizen group, headed by Kush Kanthamraju with members Yash Pawar, Sonia Salkar, Chandrika Bogati & Khushi Gad conducted on-ground surveys to identify the top five civic problems. Among these, the scourge of public tobacco spitting emerged as a standout issue, drawing attention for its detrimental impact on public spaces, sanitation, and public health. Undeterred by the challenges, the team delved deeper, conducting detailed case studies in two major cities of Goa: Mapusa and Panjim across 3 different locations; Mapusa Bus Stand, Mapusa market, Panjim Bus stand. Their findings revealed a stark reality—the proximity to spitting zones correlated with higher rates of common and severe communicable diseases. It was found that on average at the 3 locations of survey people suffering with common communicable diseases at closer proximity to spitting zone was 30% & severe communicable was 39%. Their research also shed light on the behavior of spitters, debunking the misconception that they spit indiscriminately but mostly at places usually unclean & at walls, corners & pillars. Armed with insights, the team formulated five practical solutions. These ranged from regular awareness campaigns to the strategic placement of spittoons and the implementation of fines and a special task force for enforcement. They also proposed innovative hostile architecture tactics, including artistic deterrents, strategic wall painting, installation of benches & harnessing green spaces to discourage spitting behavior & transforming these places into vibrant communal hubs. Upon submission of their report to local governments, their efforts were highly appreciated. At Panjim KTC, the students were invited to launch an awareness campaign, leading to the initiation of monthly sanitations and the installation of board-like barriers. Similarly, at Mapusa KTC, improvements in sanitation were observed alongside the implementation of strategic wall painting.

The jury was captivated by the team's detailed research, their courage in addressing an often-ignored issue, and their genuine passion for creating positive change. Their efforts were duly rewarded with the first-place prize.

NEP Quiz: 17th February 2024

The NEP Quiz was held on the 17th of February 2024 at 9:30 am. The quiz included multiple choice questions (MCQ), fill in the blanks, one word question and answer along with short answer type of Q&A. We received a good response from 441 students attempting the quiz. 73% of the students answered more than 5 questions correct.

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Anti-Tobacco Awareness Drive :23rd February 2024

On the 23rd of February, Kadamba Transport Corporation, Panjim invited the NSS unit of St. Xavier's College for an impactful 'Anti-Tobacco Spitting' awareness campaign. This campaign initiated by NSS students under Desh Apnaye Foundations' Actizen Project, their research on the health hazards of spitting resonated with KTC. This collaboration aimed to make citizens alert, informed, and active in fostering positive change. Together, they not only highlighted the consequences of tobacco spitting but also exemplified the potential of youth-led initiatives to transform public spaces into healthier, more vibrant hubs. This partnership serves as a compelling example of proactive efforts addressing civic issues and contributing to community well-being.




PM address to the Youth on the occasion of laying of foundation stone of

Interdepartmental Staff Sports Tournament: 27th March 2024


St. Xavier's College, NSS unit in collaboration with the Department of Physical Education and Sports organised Interdepartmental Staff Sports Tournament.

felicitated for taking part in the cooking competition held as a part of International Year of Millets. CSM. Arya Tivrekar presented a dance highlighting women empowerment.


ANNUAL DAY PROGRAMME 2024
