Mr. Vijay Talwar spoke about the formation of the Constituent Assembly, the various Articles, Parts, and Schedules of the Constitution, its achievements, and significant amendments made over the years. Ms. Pamela Fernandes discussed the Emergency—its causes, the government’s response, the role of Jay Prakash Narayan, and the curtailment of citizens’ rights during the period.
