Report	Talk on Social Justice and Marginalised Communities in India
Кероге	The Department of Sociology, St. Xavier's College, organized an
	insightful talk on "Social Justice and Marginalised Communities in
	India" on 9th October 2025. The session was delivered by Dr.
	Vasudha Sawaiker, Assistant Professor in Social Work at the D.D.
	Kosambi School of Social Sciences and Behavioural Studies, Goa
	University.
	The event commenced with a welcome address by Assistant
	Professor Elizabeth Bara, who set the tone for the thought-provoking
	session. Dr. Sawaiker began by exploring the relationship between
	India's legal framework, constitutional safeguards, and the
	continuing struggles of marginalised groups. She encouraged
	students to reflect critically on how well society understands
	"inequality" and "marginalisation," drawing upon the philosophies of
	Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and John Rawls—particularly the notion of justice
	as fairness.
	Connecting theory to lived experience, Dr. Sawaiker emphasized
	positionality by speaking from her own perspective as a woman with
	caste privilege. She contextualised inequality in the Indian setting,
	noting the vulnerability of both children and senior citizens as often
	overlooked groups. Further, she elaborated on the "Axis of Inclusion
	and Exclusion", clarifying distinctions between marginalisation and
	exclusion.
	To deepen engagement, a Digital Storytelling (DST) short film titled
	"Ami Kon?" was screened.
	An interactive discussion followed, with students raising pertinent
	questions about inequality . Dr. Sawaiker concluded by stressing the
	importance of "Equity over Equality" and shared her own creative

	academic experiences to inspire social awareness and change. The session concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by ms. Elisa Fernandes and the report was written by ms. Rachel Fernandez our
	TY sociology students.
