

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Value Added Course:** The Department collaborated with IQAC to organise a Value-Added Course on Background Music Direction for Tiatr, Natak & One-Act Plays, from August 8-16, 2025. The Course, designed to equip participants with practical skills in background music direction tailored specifically for Goan theatrical forms,

was conducted over six sessions with 12 enthusiastic participants. Participants gained proficiency in Virtual DJ for live playback and Audacity for audio editing, encompassing traditional Goan "Pansvo Sognit" style for cultural authenticity. Mr. Vishant Sawant, Assistant Professor in the Department of Economics and recipient of 'The Best Background Music Award' at the All Goa 47th Tiatr Utsov 'A' Group (2022) and the All-Goa Inter-School Tiatr Competition (2023-24) organized by Kala Academy Goa, was the co-ordinator of the course.

**Reel-Making Competition on 'Role of Youth in Nation- Building':** A competition was organised on the occasion of India's 79<sup>th</sup> Independence Day. The main objectives of the competition were to encourage students to creatively express their ideas on how youth can contribute to nation building, to promote awareness about the responsibilities of youth in social, economic, cultural, and political development and to provide a platform for students to showcase their communication, creativity, and digital media skills. Ms. Jacqueline Monteiro co-ordinated a presentation.



The main topics that were covered were - Mollem & Selaulim forests, Sateri Waterfall, and Mining Sites of Goa. They also brought attention to recent data on deforestation in Goa and presented a video depicting how forests were being cut down for infrastructure development.

## Department of English

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

**·TY Project Orientation Programme:** "Launchpad TY: Projects with Purpose," a Third-year Project Orientation Programme, was organised on July 5, 2025. The session was attended by 27 third-year students and four faculty members, with Ms. Alice D'Cruz as the resource person. The orientation provided students with the necessary foundation for academic research, covering crucial steps like selecting a study area, formulating a project title, conducting literature reviews, and identifying the aim, objectives, scope, and limitations of the project. Furthermore, Ms. D'Cruz shared valuable guidance on structuring, formatting the information, and successfully preparing for project viva, while stressing the importance of teamwork, endurance, and ethical research. The session successfully equipped the students with the confident and informed mindset and temperament required to approach their final year project.

**Guest Lecture, 'The horror! The horror!':** A special talk on Joseph Conrad's 'Heart of Darkness' brought together TY students enrolled in the Department of English for an academic activity focused on literary analysis and postcolonial criticism on July 31, 2025. Participants were assigned the task of critically engaging with the text 'Heart of Darkness' and the key speaker, Ms. Alice D'Cruz, provided valuable insights on the same. The lecture's aims were to examine the point of convergence between the historical background and the text, and to motivate students to develop a wider viewpoint on Colonisation.



**Value Added Course: "Back to Basics: English for Competitive Exams"** was conducted from September 2 to October 13, 2025. The course was coordinated by Ms. Giann Maria Fernandes, Assistant Professor. The course was open to students of all streams. It was curated to meet students' needs of grammar, job interview preparation and ability to answer competitive exams. Faculty of the department engaged sessions on grammar basics, tips to crack job interviews, poetry evaluation, homonyms, homographs, homophones, comprehension passages tested at competitive exams and tenses in grammar. Thirty students across streams attended the course-sessions.



**National Book Lovers Day:** This day was celebrated on National Book Lovers Day on August 9, 2025 in the College Library, with 41 students and four faculty members in attendance.

The event began with Dr. Prema Rocha, HoD, speaking on the transformative power of books. A significant aspect was the donation of a collection of books to the library, which had been collected through the WordsUp 6.0 community initiative. Faculty led first-year students in a hands-on session to explore the specific shelves and cupboards of the English literature collection, familiarizing them with diverse genres and resources.



**Farewell Ms Alice D'Cruz:** The college community gathered to bid a heartfelt farewell to Ms. Alice D'Cruz for over thirty years of exemplary service on July 31, 2025. She leaves behind a legacy of kindness and integrity and impacting generations of students. The programme was graced by dignitaries including Officiating Principal Ms. Ursula Barreto, Administrator Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema, Vice Principals, and DHE representatives Dr. Keshav Dhuri and Mr. Datta Jalmi. Rich tributes were paid, with Fr. Salema and Ms. Barreto recalling their dedication, and HoD Dr. Prema Rocha memorably remarking, "Her Aliceness is irreplaceable." Ms. Alice was officially felicitated with a Plaque of Recognition and a Token of Appreciation by DHE. Highlights included Ms. D'Cruz encouraging peers to be "like gardeners," the release of the departmental newsletter Eloquence, a video tribute, and a cake cutting ceremony for Ms. D'Cruz's birthday.





**Loutolim Field Trip:** On October 11, 2025, SY and TY English Single Major students, accompanied by Mr. Aaron-Paul Fernandes and Dr. Maria Claudette Gomes, went on a field trip to Loutolim. They visited the Figueiredo Mansion, Big Foot, and Jila Bakery. At the Figueiredo Mansion, built in 1590, the curator guided them through the 400-year-old ancestral home of the Figueiredo family, showcasing its ornate interiors, Ming dynasty vase, East India Company dish set, and gold-coated altar with ivory statues. The visit highlighted the grandeur and history of Goa's colonial past. At Big Foot, the students explored clay models and cultural exhibits that depict Goan life and traditions. The site also features Mahadev's sacred footprint and Mahendra Alvares's single-rock sculpture of Sant Mira Bai. The trip offered a rich educational experience, deepening students' appreciation of Goa's cultural heritage and the enduring blend of Goan and Portuguese influences.

## Department of Hindi

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Tulsidas Evam Premchand Divas** was celebrated on July 31, 2025 in the college seminar hall. HOD Dr. Ramita Gurav highlighted the contribution of the two great writers to Hindi literature. Students of TYBA presented PowerPoint slides on their lives and a skit based on Premchand's story *Bade Ghar Ki Beti*. Chief Guest Ms. Ursula Barreto and Special Guest Mr. Dharma Chodankar spoke about the moral values reflected in their works. The event, attended by 92 students, was coordinated by Ms. Priyanka Pednekar and compered by Ms. Saba Ansari.

**'Patrakarita ka Vartamaan Paridrishya':** A guest lecture titled 'Patrakarita ka Vartamaan Paridrishya' was organised on July 25, 2025, in the seminar hall. The session focused on the positive and negative aspects of modern media. Resource person Mr. Mayabhushan Nagvenkar discussed the influence of journalism in shaping public opinion and stressed ethical reporting. He highlighted how sensationalism often overshadows truth and urged students to uphold integrity in media practices. Around 200 students attended the session.



**One-Day State-Level Workshop:** The Department organised a one-day State-Level Workshop on 'Vrittachitra Nirman' (Documentary Making) on August 23, 2025. Resource person Mr. Siddesh Naik, an award-winning Goan film editor and casting director, shared his expertise in documentary production and editing. He demonstrated key techniques and guided students through hands-on activities. The workshop encouraged creative exploration in filmmaking and media communication. Over 100 students and teachers from seven colleges across Goa participated.



**Value Added Course:** The Department, in collaboration with the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism, organised a Value Added Course titled 'Story to Screen: Creative Skills for Film and TV Production' on October 4, 2025. Film director and scriptwriter Mr. Ronak Kamat served as the resource person. He shared insights on scriptwriting and screened his documentary Caazu, along with excerpts from his OTT projects PI Meena and Power of Paanch. The session also featured a conversation with Dr. Ramita Gurav and Ms. Vailarose Fernandes. Participants gained a deeper understanding of writing, creativity, and digital storytelling.

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**Singing Competition:** 'Bharat Tujhe Salaam...' was organised on August 13, 2025 to celebrate patriotism through music. Judges Mr. Pritesh Bandekar and Ms. Saily Mandrekar, both alumni of the college, evaluated the participants in solo and group categories. The competition aimed to foster artistic expression and national pride among students. Winners received trophies, medals, and certificates from the judges. The event was vibrant and engaging, drawing enthusiastic participation and appreciation from students and faculty.

**Hindi Diwas Celebration:** 'Hindi Diwas Samaroh' was celebrated on September 25-26, 2025 to promote the love for Hindi language and literature. Various competitions such as poetry, story writing, essay writing, monologue, singing, and sketch making were organised under on-stage and off-stage categories. **Field Trip:** A field trip was organised to the Khushawati Heritage Trail on October 9, 2025. ## Department of History

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

- **Quiz competition:** An engaging quiz competition centred on the theme “The Evolution of Democracy in England” was organised. The event aimed to deepen students’ understanding of the historical milestones, key figures, and significant reforms that shaped the democratic framework in England over the centuries. Participants were divided into two groups. This quiz explored topics ranging from the signing of the Magna Carta in 1215 to the development of constitutional monarchy, the expansion of suffrage, and the evolution of parliamentary institutions. A highlight of the programme was an on-the-spot re-enactment of a historical character, vividly portrayed by Ms. Lines Rodrigues, which brought history to life and added a dynamic, theatrical dimension to the academic event. The quiz was co-ordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais.
- **Student Internship Programme:** From August to September 2025, eleven students from TYBA participated in a research-oriented internship programme at the Xavier Centre of Historical Research (XCHR) under the supervision of Fr. Rinald D’Souza. The internship focused on working with the visual archive of Gritli von Mitterwallner’s photographs. Students catalogued the photographs, a process that required meticulous handling, detailed documentation, and adherence to archival standards. The internship was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais.
- **50 Years Since Emergency:** To commemorate 75 Years of the Indian Constitution and 50 Years since Emergency, a talk was jointly coordinated by the Departments of History and Political Science. This session was held to enlighten the students on the significance of these two aspects and to promote responsible citizenship. It was coordinated by Ms. Pamela Fernandes.



**Goa Through a Historical Lens:** Students from the Department of History, St. Xavier’s College-Mapusa, FYBA (Major), creatively showcased Goa’s vibrant natural and cultural heritage on July 25, 2025. It was an engaging display of the state’s diverse flora, including medicinal plants, marine life such as fish and shells; and the region’s unique culinary traditions, highlighting local delicacies. The exhibit also featured bamboo mats, handcrafted fans, and shell ornaments. They offered an immersive experience of ecological and cultural richness of Goa.



**Flag Day:** In August 2025, TYBA students participated in the Flag Day Commemoration, an event organised to honour the nation's armed forces and create awareness about their sacrifices and dedication. During the programme, students were educated on the significance of the Indian national flag, its history, and the proper protocols to follow while handling or displaying it. The classroom was beautifully decorated for the occasion, creating a festive and respectful atmosphere. The event was highlighted with a visual image of the flag on the Smart Board and ceremonial cutting of a cake. Through this event, students not only gained a deeper understanding of patriotism and civic responsibility but also experienced firsthand the importance of acknowledging and appreciating the contributions of those who serve the nation.

**Launch of E-Newsletter:** On August 15, 2025, the Department of History proudly launched the second volume of its e-newsletter, *The Chronicle*. This digital publication aims to keep students, faculty, alumni, and history enthusiasts informed about the latest developments, research initiatives, events, and activities within the department.

**Sadbhavana Diwas:** On August 25, 2025, Sadbhavana Diwas was organised by SYBA History students to promote the spirit of peace, harmony, and national unity. The programme aimed to instil among students the values of tolerance, goodwill, and mutual respect for a strong and united nation. This was followed by a Poster Creation Competition on the theme of National Integration, where students showcased their creativity and understanding through vibrant, thought-provoking artworks reflecting the essence of unity and brotherhood. The posters were later displayed in the college library for all to view and appreciate. The event reinforced the message of patriotism and an inclusive nation. The programme was coordinated by Mr. Dominic Fernandes.

**Traditional Goan Culinary Skills without Fire:** On September 25, 2025, a unique culinary competition was organised, with the theme "Traditional Goan Culinary Skills without fire". The event focused on exploring culinary creativity using techniques that do not involve heat. Each dish was evaluated based on creativity, presentation and overall execution by a panel of judges. The competition was a great success with a rewarding and enjoyable experience for everyone involved. The programme was coordinated by Mr. Dominic Fernandes.

**Gandhi Jayanti:** A talk on “Gandhi – the Man, his Message” was delivered by Ms. Pamela Fernandes. The talk focussed on Mahatma Gandhi’s philosophy and his mission to promote peace and brotherhood by standing up against injustice through non-violent ways. Students also participated in a paper-pencil quiz in pairs to check how much they knew of the man who led India to independence from colonial rule of over 150 years.



**Role Play:** The students of TYBA History presented a captivating role play titled “The Court of Versailles under Louis XIV”. The performance vividly recreated the splendour, politics, and personalities of the seventeenth-century French court during the reign of Louis XIV, known as the Sun King. The play began with the early life of Louis XIV, depicting his dependence on his mother Anne of Austria and his mentor Cardinal Mazarin. The scenes that followed brought the magnificent Palace of Versailles to life, portraying the grand rituals, strict etiquette, and lavish lifestyle that symbolised royal power. Characters such as Madame de Montespan and Jean-Baptiste Colbert illustrated the influence and intrigue of court life. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais.

**History Study Tour:** In October 2025, 30 History students along with four faculty went on a history study tour to explore Goa’s heritage sites in North Goa. The tour began included a visit to the Surla Tar Mosque in Bicholim, the Jain monument, Mayem Lake, the oldest stone memorial at Poriem, Saptakoteshwar Temple in Bicholim and the Corjuem Fort. The study tour not only complemented classroom learning but also offered hands-on experience in observing, analysing, and appreciating historical sites, making it a memorable and educational journey for all participants. The tour was curated by Mr. Vivek Mandrekar and Mr. Dominic Fernandes.

- **Certificate Course:** The Department of History conducted a 30-hour course on Fundamentals of Research and Ethics from July to October 2025. The course was designed to equip students of the college with essential research skills and an understanding of ethical practices in academic investigation. Nine students benefited from the course, which was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais.
- **Kargil Diwas:** The Department, in collaboration with the NSS Unit and the Cell for Career Guidance and Training for Competitive Examinations, organised an event themed “Setting the Sails for Success: Careers in the Indian Navy”, on the occasion of Kargil Vijay Diwas on July 25, 2025. The event was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais and aimed to honour the bravery of India’s armed forces while inspiring students to explore meaningful careers in national service. The programme was graced by Commodore Srikant B. Kesnur, VSM, PhD (Retd), distinguished naval officer, military historian, and motivational speaker. In his engaging and insightful address, Commodore Kesnur began by paying tribute to the martyrs and heroes of the Kargil War, highlighting the strategic importance of Kargil Vijay Diwas as a day of national remembrance and pride.
- **Celebrating Harmony:** As a proactive step towards nurturing social responsibility, “Role of Students in Promoting Peace and Harmony” was organised on July 10, 2025. Recognising the critical influence young people wield as future leaders and current community members, this initiative aimed to foster a culture of peace and harmony within the college and beyond. Coordinated by Dr Sharmila Pais, the programme emphasised the important role that can be played by the youth in bridging divides, challenging prejudice through dialogue and critical thinking, promoting mutual respect amidst diversity, and actively building inclusive communities.

In September 2025, students of TYBA, History were encouraged to engage in a Coffee Table Series titled “The Wonder That Was Bharat”. The Series aimed to involve students in research discussions on India’s rich cultural, historical, and scientific heritage through interactive sessions and presentations. Students and faculty dialogued in an informal setting to explore three captivating aspects of ancient India: transportation, art, and indigenous food. The discussion on transportation highlighted the ingenuity of ancient Indian civilisations in developing efficient trade routes, maritime networks, and modes of travel that connected regions across the subcontinent. The Series was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais.

## BEST PRACTICES

- **Kilo Campaign:** On July 30, 2025, a social outreach activity was organised with the students of History, FYBA (minor) and the SYMC. Non-perishable consumable items were donated towards the orphanage, St. Alex Home, Calangute. This was coordinated by Ms. Pamela Fernandes.

## Department of Philosophy

## Department of Political Science

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

**The Political Leadership Challenge:** Two student-led sessions on “The Political Leadership Challenge” were organised on August 2 and August 9, 2025. Students were divided into four teams, each representing a political party at the state level. Every team selected a leader and developed a campaign speech highlighting their party's ideology, key promises, and leadership style. Teams then identified a crisis related to their ideology and held internal discussions simulating a cabinet meeting to formulate appropriate responses. The exercise concluded with public and media statements, followed by a mock press interaction where teams faced questions and criticism. The event was coordinated by Ms. Tricia Vaz e Borges.

**Mock Panchayat Election:** SYBA Political Science students conducted a “Mock Panchayat Election” to provide hands-on understanding of the election process. Tanisha Divkar, Raisal Carvalho, and Anallie Dias contested the election after campaigning on their proposed improvements. On polling day, Election Commissioner Rency Nayak announced the commencement of voting. The polling booth was managed by Presiding Officers Akansha Parsekar and Sania Mayekar, Polling Agent Brid Kandolkar, and BLO Aditi Satelkar, who verified voters and supervised the process. Students voted using ballot papers and cast their votes in secrecy. After voting concluded, Returning Officer Riddhi Naik sealed and counted the ballots before announcing the results along with the Election Commissioner. Tanisha Divkar was declared the winner and later interviewed by media reporter Amiti Pujari. The entire event was coordinated by Ms. Rashika Raikar.

**International Day of Democracy:** A group presentation to commemorate “International Day of Democracy” was organised on September 15, 2025 for SYBA students. Two groups participated in the presentations, each consisting of three members, which encouraged diverse ideas and active collaboration. The topics covered were “Why Institutions are Pillars of a Strong Democracy?” and “Youth Participation in Strengthening Democracy.” Group 1, comprising Aryan Luke D’Costa, Sharmat Sanjay Goltekar, and Anish Bhiva Naik, addressed the first topic, while Group 2, consisting of Aaditi Arvind Satelkar, Kajal Sudesh Vernekar, and Raisel Carvalho, focused on the second topic. The coordinator was Mr. Vijay Talwar.

**Slogans:** A session on “Slogans pertaining to Social, Economic and Environmental Issues in India” was held on September 16, 2025. It aimed to raise awareness, inspire and develop thinking skills and creative abilities. Students had to simplify complex issues using slogans to encourage participation in campaigns. A total of 32 students from FYBSc and FYBCom participated in this activity. The faculty in-charge was Ms. Gauri Rao.

**Local Self Governments:** A session on “Local Self Governments in Goa” was conducted on September 20, 22 and 24, 2025 for the students of SYBA. The students were divided into six groups, and each group made a presentation. The main focus of this activity was to encourage the students to understand the functioning of local self-governments in Goa, its evolution, functions and structure, and difference between urban and rural governance. Thirty students participated in the session coordinated by Ms. Rashika Raikar.

**Counterterrorism, Political Anxiety, and Legitimacy:** A thought-provoking session, featuring a student-led review of the scholarly article “Counterterrorism, Political Anxiety, and Legitimacy in Postcolonial India and Egypt” authored by Alice Finden and Sagnik Dutta, was organised on September 26, 2025. Ms. Tianna Lobo and Ms. Mansi Halarnkar, students of FYBA Political Science (Major), led the presentation, unpacking the article’s core arguments and contextual relevance. Their review explored how counterterrorism policies intersect with political legitimacy and public anxiety in postcolonial democracies, drawing parallels between India and Egypt. The presenters highlighted the authors’ critique of state narratives, the role of media and surveillance, and the implications for civil liberties and democratic accountability. Mr. Prasad Naik coordinated the session.

**Value-Added Course:** A Value-Added Course titled “Basics of Research in Political Science” was organised from August 6-16, with 37 students participating. The course included four modules covering various aspects of research methodology. The Co-ordinator of the course was Assistant Professor Mr. Prasad Naik, and co-coordinator was Assistant Professor Ms. Gauri Rao. The activity was carried out with overall guidance and logistical support from the administration and Ms. Tricia Vaz e Borges, Head of the Department of Political Science.

**Alumnus Talk:** An alumnus talk on “Prospects of Higher Education in Political Science at the National Level” was organised on August 25, 2025. The resource person was Ms. Maithili Chumbalkar, an alumna of St. Xavier’s College (Batch 2020–2023) and currently a Master’s student at Delhi University. Ms. Chumbalkar shared insights into her academic journey and guided students on pursuing higher education in Political Science across reputed national institutions. She discussed various entrance examinations, preparation strategies, and opportunities for internships in the field. The talk was interactive and well-received by the 42 participating SYBA and TYBA students (Single Major). The event was coordinated by Ms. Gauri Rao.

**Poster Exhibition:** A poster exhibition to commemorate “75 Years of Indian Constitution (Hamara Samvidhan Hamara Swabhiman)” and “79<sup>th</sup> Independence Day (Honouring Freedom, Inspiring the Future)” was organised from August 15-18, 2025. The exhibition showcased over 80 creative posters prepared by FYBA and FYBSc students enrolled in the Constitutional Values and Obligations (VAC) course. The works reflected the spirit of the Constitution, highlighted civic duties, and celebrated India’s journey of freedom and democracy over the past eight decades. The exhibition was coordinated by Ms. Gauri Rao and Ms. Rashika Raikar.

**National Level Online Quiz:** A National Level Online Quiz to commemorate India’s 79th Independence Day, with the aim of spreading awareness about the freedom struggle, national heroes, and patriotic values among students as well as the general public, was organised on August 15, 2025. The quiz was held online. Participants who scored 60% or above received e-certificates. A total of 331 people (48 from other states) took part in this National Level Online Quiz. **Field visit:** The students of TYBA Political Science enrolled for Minor VET paper, “Democracy and Legal Literacy in India”. went on a field trip to the District and Session Court, Mercas, Goa on October 3, 2025. It provided students with first-hand exposure to the functioning of the judiciary, helping them understand role of legal procedures. A total of 29 students participated in the visit and were accompanied by Mr. Vijay Talwar and Ms. Gauri Rao.

**Legislative Assembly visit:** On October 6, 2025, students of FYBA Political Science visited the Goa Legislative Assembly Complex as part of an educational initiative to strengthen their understanding of democratic governance. The visit commenced with a guided tour by Mr. Deepak Bhosle, Marshall of the State Assembly, who explained the structure, rules, and functioning of the legislature. Students then engaged in interactive sessions with elected representatives. The Hon’ble MLA of Aldona, Shri Carlos Alvares Ferreira, emphasised the importance of youth participation in democracy, while the Hon’ble Deputy Speaker and MLA of Mapusa, Shri Joshua de Souza, an alumnus of the college, elaborated on the roles of the Speaker and Deputy Speaker. ## Department of Psychology

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

**All India Level Webinar:** To observe World Suicide Prevention Day, an 'All-India level webinar: Voices of Life Lecture Series 4' was jointly organised by St. Xavier's College, Goa; SMT M.M.P. Shah Women's College, Mumbai; and the Indian Association of Life Skills Education (IALSE), Chennai on September 10, 2025 on the theme "Strengthening Life Skills for Resilience and Suicide Prevention". 1. The event aimed to raise awareness, reduce stigma, and foster open conversations around mental health. The theme highlighted the transition from silence and stigma toward compassion, support, and resilience. The keynote speaker, Dr. Avinash D'Souza, highlighted the role of life skills and the Adversity Quotient in building resilience, while Dr. A. Radhakrishnan Nair stressed the rise of suicides among youth and the need for institutional life-skills training. Dr. Archana Patki, Principal, MMP Shah College, Mumbai, expressed gratitude to IALSE for spearheading the series. Coordinating Faculty for the webinar was Prof. Janet Fernandes.



**Value Added Course:** Dr. Arti Kandolkar, Founder, Beautiful Mind and Soul, Pune was the resource person for a VAC on "Psychological Testing and Technology: Applications, Opportunities and Challenges". The course was held on October 6, 2025 for the final year students of Psychology. Around 34 students attended the session. Dr. Arti highlighted how knowledge of psychological tests and its application is central to most psychological fields. The students were updated with regard to certifications required, including qualifications required and cost factor. She shared her experiences dealing with various clients covering from learning disabilities to personality disorders and career and vocational counselling. Students interacted with a lot of queries and also had their doubts cleared on how to pursue testing as a potential career option. She gave the students a road map on how to pursue their careers in testing. This VAC was coordinated by Dr. Ubaldina Noronha.

**VAC on Mendeley Referencing System:** On August 21, 2025, Ms. Dakshata Zambulkar, Librarian, gave an extensive presentation on how to register and make an account on Mendeley, how to import references, how to create categories in the library dashboard, and how to use the different facilities on the Mendeley platform. Each student was made to register and learn the operating elements of the Mendeley platform. The course proved to be new learning and a good practice to enrich project work and research endeavours. The VAC was coordinated by Prof. Janet Fernandes.



**St. Alex Orphanage, Calangute:** Around 22 SY Psychology students visited St. Alex Orphanage, Calangute on October 4, 2025. Students were warmly welcomed and began with introductions, followed by ice-breaker games, action songs, and dance activities that helped create an engaging, joyful atmosphere. Creative tasks such as mehendi application, handprint art featuring the college logo, and hair-braiding encouraged bonding and self-expression. A lively game of musical chairs added to the fun. **IPHB Visit:** The TYBA Psychology students visited the Institute of Psychiatry and Human Behaviour (IPHB), Goa on October 1, 2025 for an academic exposure programme aimed at understanding hospital functioning, therapeutic practices, and psychological assessments. The visit comprised two structured sessions. The first session introduced the 24 students to the hospital's system and provided an overview of psychotherapy, including behavioural, cognitive, and CBT approaches. The second session focused on psychological assessment tools used in clinical diagnosis, treatment planning and progress monitoring. The visit offered valuable insight into the practical side of clinical psychology, bridging academic learning with professional practice and inspiring students to explore the field further. The visit was coordinated by Prof Janet Fernandes and Ms. Nezima Lawrence.





**World Suicide Prevention Day:** The Department, in collaboration with the Wellness Centre, organised a World Suicide Prevention Day programme on September 9, 2025 to promote mental health awareness and support. Senior Psychiatrist Dr. Rajesh Dhume delivered the keynote address, emphasising compassion, early intervention, and the need to support those in distress. TYBA students presented a powerful street play on hope and suicide prevention, followed by a collective pledge led by College Counsellor Ms. Beverly Monteiro. Dignitaries

participated in the lamp-lighting ceremony. Dance performances and a poem titled “Silent Whispers” added emotional depth to the programme. A flash mob, creative stalls, and artistic displays further enhanced engagement. The event concluded with a vote of thanks, reinforcing the college’s commitment to fostering empathy, wellbeing, and community support. Ms Nezima Lawrence coordinated the programme.



**Educational Visit to Sangath:** On September 16, 2025 FYBA Psychology (Major) students participated in an educational visit to Sangath, Porvorim. The students were accompanied by Dr. Eulalia Fernandes. The visit featured insightful sessions led by various professionals who shared their personal and professional journeys, emphasising the impactful role Sangath has played in their development.

**Educational Visit to Lokvishwas Prathisthan:** A group of 29 TYBA Psychology students visited Lokvishwas Prathisthan, Ponda – an institute dedicated to the education and rehabilitation of children with visual and hearing impairments, as well as intellectual disabilities. The visit was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Eulalia Fernandes, Associate Professor of Psychology. The students had the opportunity to observe classroom activities, interact with educators and therapists, and understand how individualised care plans are implemented for each child based on their specific needs. The staff also explained the different methods used for communication with hearing-impaired students, such as sign language, and for visually impaired students, including the use of Braille and assistive technologies. Students gained valuable insights into the psychological principles applied in real-life settings, especially in managing behavioural issues and promoting adaptive functioning.

**Sexual Harassment talk:** A talk was held on September 29, 2025 to appraise students of sexual harassment at the workplace, especially the legal procedures under Section 2(n) and Section 3 of the POSH Act. Thirty-four TYBA Honours students attended the talk.



**Mental Health Day** was observed on October 9, 2025 to promote emotional wellbeing and encourage open conversations. The programme featured a powerful mime, an open mic session, certificate distribution for the poster competition, and an inspiring address by Rev. Fr. Antonio Salema. A lively flash mob concluded the performances. Interactive activities followed, including Ping Pong Trivia, Pop Your Insecurities, an Art Table, Take What You Need Corner, Inside Out emotions sorting, positive-affirmation mirrors, mehendi, and a Sticker Counter. ## Department of SOCIOLOGY

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Distinguished Alumni Lecture Series:** The Department, under its Distinguished Alumni Lecture Series, hosted a talk by Prof. Joanna Pereira Coelho, Vice Dean of the D. D. Kosambi School of Social Sciences, on August 6, 2025. Prof. Coelho's lecture, "Collective Constructions among Tibetans in Exile," explored how Tibetan nationalism evolved after the 1959 Exodus of the Dalai Lama and his followers to India. She discussed how the Central Tibetan Administration, the Dalai Lama's leadership, and global support transformed a diverse Tibetan society into a cohesive national identity. The talk also examined the fusion of Buddhist and secular democratic values and the integration of science into monastic education. Prof. Coelho concluded with reflections on Tibetan unity and challenges beyond the Dalai Lama's lifetime. Forty-seven students and three teachers attended. The activity was coordinated by Prof. Afonso Botelho.

**Social Justice lecture:** A lecture on "Social Justice and Marginalised Communities in India" was organised on October 9, 2025. The session was delivered by Dr Vasudha Sawaiker, Assistant Professor in Social Work (Adjunct) at the D. D. Kosambi School of Social Sciences and Behavioural Studies, Goa University. The lecture explored issues of inequality, marginalisation, and the pursuit of social justice, aligning with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 4: Quality Education and SDG 10: Reduced Inequalities). The session was open to all and witnessed active participation from students and faculty members. The activity was coordinated by Ms. Elizabeth Bara.





**Study Tour:** The Department of Sociology, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, organised a study tour to Coorg from August 29 to September 2, 2025, to provide students with a field-based learning experience linking theory to practice. Twenty-nine students from FYBA, SYBA, and TYBA participated, accompanied by Prof. Afonso Botelho, Ms. Sayed Rizwana, and Ms. Elizabeth Bara. The itinerary included visits to the Tibetan Monastery, coffee plantations, tribal settlements, and local markets, where students observed social life, traditions, and community structures. The tour enhanced students' research skills, teamwork, and cultural sensitivity while fostering independent learning. Faculty commended their discipline and engagement. **Quiz Competition:** An Inter-Collegiate Quiz Competition was organised on the theme "Sociology and Sociologists" on October 15, 2025. The event was coordinated by Ms. Shivani Calangutcar and Ms. Simran Kumar. The primary objective of the competition was to encourage critical thinking, enhance sociological understanding, and foster meaningful interaction among students beyond classroom learning. Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, Margao won first place while Rosary College of Commerce and Arts, Navelim came in second and third place was bagged by Fr. Agnel College of Arts and Commerce, Pilar. The Rolling Trophy was awarded to Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science, Margao.



**Essay Competition:** An Essay Competition was organised on the theme “Nasha Mukta Abhiyan” on August 7, 2025. The event, held under the ‘Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyaan’ of the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, aimed to raise awareness about the harmful effects of drug abuse and promote a drug-free lifestyle among youth. Seventy-three students from FYBA, SYBA, and TYBA participated enthusiastically. Entries were judged on originality, clarity, and relevance, with Ms. Rachel Fernandes (TYBA) winning the First Prize. The event was coordinated by the Department of Sociology with support from the College Administration, following guidelines from the Directorate of Social Welfare, Goa.

**Film Screenings:** The TYBA single major students watched the film ‘Oliver Twist’ on August 5, 2025. A discussion on the same followed, guided by Asst. Prof. Sayed Rizwana P. A discussion was initiated by Asst. Prof. Sayed Rizwana P. on feminism as a factor contributing to sociological theories.

**Lemon exercise:** An activity was conducted on July 22, 2025 for SYBA students to sharpen the descriptive style of writing. The students had instructions to close their eyes and follow what the teacher (Ms Elizabeth, a certified Microphenomenologist) was narrating. They were being walked into a moment of being in their kitchen and cutting a lime, smelling it, and lastly tasting the same. The visual, olfactory, and tactile senses that they experienced were then written as a descriptive account.

**Debate:** Ms. Elizabeth Bara conducted a debate on “The Dowry System in India” on July 23, 2025. The topic of the debate was the dowry system in India. The teams were divided into the ET(Extraterrestrial) group and the human group. The ET group held the view that the socio-cultural practice of dowry is illogical and should be abolished, and the human group supported the idea that dowry has a socio-cultural significance for India, and rather than being abolished, it should be reformed as a legal gifting practice. The debate was aimed at engaging students critically with the notion of dowry, which would be beneficial in understanding a critical style of writing.

**Film screening:** On July 30, 2025, a short documentary film, “Juice,” was screened for FYBSc and FYBCom students. The film was based on a common middle-class Indian household; the film unfolds the idea of patriarchy through the practice of gender norms and practices.



**Sociology Day:** The Department of Sociology celebrated Sociology Day on October 10, 2025 to promote sociological thinking and creativity among students. The programme featured a Folksong Singing Competition, Poster Making Competition, Skit on Changing Family Patterns, ‘Just a Minute’- extempore, and Monologue – Portraying a Sociologist, along with a pre-event Essay Competition. Ms. Sayed Rizwana Parveen, the Event coordinator, emphasised the relevance of sociology in understanding society and social change.

The session was attended by 78 students and seven teachers. The aim of the session was to introduce students to the scope of entrepreneurship in the field of mushroom farming. The guest speaker Ms. Trupti Bhushan Dhakate, founder of Quality Mushroom Farm, spoke about the various types of mushrooms she cultivates and her experience in setting up and running a successful mushroom farm.





**Wildflower Arrangement Competition:** A Wildflower Arrangement Competition as organised on August 9, 2025, fostering creativity and appreciation for nature among students. The competition was coordinated by Prof. Maria Fonseca and Mr. Conceicao De Souza. The participants skilfully crafted their floral designs, incorporating vibrant wild blooms in innovative ways. Each team presented their arrangement with a creative title, reflecting themes of sustainability and natural beauty.

One locally available plant is studied and displayed for all students and teachers of the college. ## Department of Chemistry

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Orientation Session:** A special orientation session on library resources and facilities was organised on July 31, 2025 for the TYBSc Chemistry students. The session was conducted by Librarian Ms. Dakshata Zambulkar with the aim of familiarising students with the various library services and promoting the effective use of resources for academic and research purposes. Ms. Zambulkar explained the use of reference materials, e-resources, online journals, and databases, and provided hands-on training on accessing and using these tools efficiently. The session was highly informative and encouraged students to develop research-oriented learning habits. It helped them recognize the importance of the library as a center for academic excellence. The event was coordinated by Ms. Kathleen Pinto, Head of the Chemistry Department.

**Certificate Course:** A 30-hour Certificate Course on Introduction to Quantum Chemistry and Computational Chemistry was floated, in associating with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college. Dr. Johnross Albuquerque conducted the sessions. About 15 students registered for the course and three sessions have been held thus far, on September 9, 23 and 30, 2025. In all these sessions, basic concepts like the Schrodinger Equation, operators, etc were covered and students were introduced to Gaussview software for visualising molecules.



**Third-Year Chemistry Students' Quiz:**

The Annual Third-Year Chemistry Students' Quiz was held on September 23, 2025 as an intra-class event. The quiz aimed to enhance students' aptitude and reinforce core chemistry concepts. The event was coordinated by Dr. Mira Parmekar. A total of 35 students participated in the written preliminary round, with the top 10 students qualifying for the oral quiz.



**Session on “Research in Chemistry”:** A talk on “Research in Chemistry” was organised on September 27, 2025 for the TYBSc Chemistry students. The session aimed to create awareness about research-based learning and the diverse opportunities in chemical research. The resource persons were Ms. Shivta Mhamal and Ms. Flavia Travasso, research scholars and assistant professors at St. Xavier's College. The programme was coordinated by Ms. Kathleen Pinto. Around 40 students attended the session. Ms. Flavia discussed emerging areas such as organic synthesis, green chemistry, nanomaterials, and catalysis, stressing the importance of sustainability in research. Ms. Shivta guided students on preparing and publishing research papers, illustrating key sections through a sample article. The session encouraged students to pursue innovative, eco-friendly research for societal advancement.



**Narcotic Drugs Awareness:** A session on “General Awareness on Illegal Use of Narcotic Drugs” was organised by the UG and PG Departments of Chemistry on August 9, 2025. The resource person was Ms. Meghna M. Jadhav, Clinical Psychologist at Tele Manas Cell, South Goa District Hospital. The session aimed to raise awareness about drug abuse, its consequences, and government initiatives for prevention and rehabilitation. Ms. Jadhav explained types of drugs, including opioids, stimulants, and depressants, and discussed addiction, precursors, and synthetic chemicals. She also demonstrated the Tele Manas helpline and engaged students with a quiz. The session was coordinated by Ms. Kathleen Pinto and Ms. Rupali Neji.



#### **Chemistry Department Cleanliness Drive:**

A cleanliness drive was organised on October 3, 2025 as part of the Swachh Bharat Mission. The initiative aimed to promote hygiene, safety, and environmental responsibility within the Chemistry laboratories. Faculty members, along with TYBSc Chemistry students actively participated in the drive, cleaning lab benches, glassware, and storage areas, and ensuring proper organization of laboratory equipment. Emphasis was

placed on waste segregation, safe disposal of materials, and maintaining cleanliness standards essential for a safe working environment. The activity fostered teamwork and a sense of shared responsibility among the students and staff. It also encouraged awareness about the importance of cleanliness in scientific practice and sustainable lab management. Through this initiative, the department reaffirmed its commitment to the Swachh Bharat Mission and to creating a clean, safe, and inspiring space for learning and research.



**Field Visit:** A field trip was organised to the National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), Vasco-da-Gama, on October 16, 2025 for TYBSc Chemistry students. A group of 39 students, accompanied by four faculty members, had the unique opportunity to interact with scientists at India's premier institute for Polar and Ocean research. Dr. Archana Singh, Scientist D, briefed the group on NCPOR's key mandates, including the 20, Indian Antarctic and Arctic Programs and Southern Ocean studies, highlighting their contribution to national policy formulation. Students were taken on a guided tour of advanced laboratories such as the SEM-EDS, Polar Biology, Geology, and Cryobiology Labs, gaining insights into sophisticated research techniques. The enriching visit, coordinated by Mr. Mahesh Nair, inspired many students to pursue future research opportunities at NCPOR.

## Department of Microbiology

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Identifying and Sampling of Mosquito Larvae:** A hands-on training workshop was organised in collaboration with the ICMR-National Institute of Malaria Research (NIMR) for five TYBSc Microbiology students at NIMR, Field Unit, Campal, Goa, from September 8-11, 2025. Ms. Aayushka Naik, Mr. Joel Fernandes, Ms. Renuka Parwar, Ms. Sania Chodankar and Mr. Shubham Yeshwant worked with bacteria associated with mosquito larvae. The aim of this workshop was to enhance their knowledge and understanding of the same. The students were welcomed by Dr. Ajeet Mohanty, Officer In-Charge, NIMR, who provided a brief understanding of the facilities and on-going research at NIMR. The students were introduced to research scholars at NIMR who provided the students with hands-on training on the sampling, processing, and identification of mosquito larvae belonging to three different genera: Anopheles, Aedes, and Culex. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Trelita de Sousa.




**VAC:** A two-month Value-Added Course was conducted from July 21, 2025 to September 20, 2025 on "Preservation and Packaging of Vegetables by Fermentation. Fresh vegetables like carrots, cabbage, onions and cauliflower were fermented by encouraging the growth of lactic acid bacteria (LAB). Beyond microbial processes, students were guided to consider aspects of product presentation. The exercise encouraged creative application of microbiology knowledge, as 48 students worked in groups and experimented with packaging and presentation to make the fermented vegetables appealing. The reel making to boost sale of the product encouraged students to use skill of videography to advertise as well as monetise the fermented vegetables. The training was coordinated by Ms. Arina Frank.



**International Microorganism Day:** To celebrate the International Microorganism Day, the third edition of the flagship State-Level Intercollegiate Competition in Life Sciences was organised in collaboration with the Microbiologists Society India (MBSI) on September 17-18, 2025. The event was co-ordinated by Dr. Valerie Gonsalves. The event brought together 105 students from educational institutes across Goa, who competed with enthusiasm, creativity, and

scientific zeal. After two days of spirited competition, the team from Discipline of Biotechnology, School of Biological Sciences and Biotechnology, Goa University emerged victorious, lifting the coveted Proteus 3.0 trophy. Runners-up were Ponda Education Society's Ravi S. Naik College of Arts and Science followed by Government College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Khandola.



**“The Invisible Majority”:** A bulletin board-designing competition was organised in association with Microbiologists Society, India from September 8-17, October, 2025, to create awareness among students about the fascinating and diverse world of microorganisms and their roles in our lives. The competition was co-ordinated by Dr. Valerie Gonsalves. This competition provided students a platform to showcase microbiology through a visual medium. It also sought to foster creativity, teamwork, and scientific curiosity. The boards were evaluated on creativity, content and visual appeal. A total of around 52 students participated in the competition, presenting a total of 19 bulletin boards.



**“MicroQuest”:** The quiz competition was organized in association with the Microbiologists’ Society, India for FY students on Microbial Ecology and Environment on October 11 and 14, 2025. Twenty-seven students participated. The event was coordinated by Dr. Trelita de Sousa.



**Field Trip:** A field trip was organised for 52 students of TYBSc Microbiology on October 16, 2025. Mr. Rahul Kulkarni, a soil scientist at ICAR-CCARI delivered an informative lecture on the history and objectives of ICAR explaining its contribution to agricultural development and innovation. He introduced the concept of Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) which focuses on transferring laboratory research to farmers through practical and field-level applications. He discussed the types of soil found in Goa, various crop varieties and the institute’s emphasis on natural farming. Following the session, students toured the campus, observing bush pepper, dwarf arecanut, cashew plantations and the Shweta Kapila, Goa’s indigenous breed of cattle. The importance of soil microorganisms, bacteriophages and plant-associated viruses in maintaining soil health and promoting sustainable farming was discussed conceptually. The field trip was coordinated by Dr. Marielou Ferrao, Dr. Valerie Gonsalves and Dr. Trelita de Sousa.



**Field Trip:** Sixty SYBSc SEC (Microbiology) students, accompanied by Ms. Arina Frank, Ms. Ruella D'Souza, Mr. Siddhesh Menon and Dr. Marielou Ferrao visited the GoVeda Dairy farm on October 3, 2025, to understand the practical aspects of milk production and milk product production and processing. Farm co-founder Mr. Rajeev Narvekar explained the preparation of curd and how it is further processed into butter, ghee and buttermilk with the help of churning machines. This visit provided valuable insights into dairy microbiology, indigenous cattle rearing, and sustainable dairy practices.

## BEST PRACTICES

- Students of FY/SY/TY contribute enthusiastically to the bulletin board by submitting articles and creative content on a chosen microbiological theme for the month and organising the data into visually appealing boards. This activity is coordinated by Dr. Valerie Gonsalves.
- With the aim of encouraging and improving critical thinking and presentation skills of students, the Journal Club organises paper presentations and panel discussions for students of FY/SY/TY. The co-ordinator for this activity is Dr. Trelita de Sousa.
- Used cotton plugs are employed during FY/SY/TY practicals to disinfect tabletops and other equipment. Newspapers are used for wrapping plates, flasks, etc. and thus efficiently reused and recycled.
- The laboratories are equipped with designated bins for sorting, collection and proper disposal of different types of waste generated in the laboratories.
- Students are encouraged to bring low-maintenance plants that are easy to grow, care for and which can thrive in indoor conditions. These plants are noted for their air purifying capabilities as well as for their aesthetic appeal, thus creating an engaging, sustainable and healthy environment for students and faculty. ### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

## Department of BCA

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

**Full Stack Development Workshop:** This was held on October 15, 2025 in the BCA lab for TYBCA students. This session aimed to provide practical knowledge about the Full Stack Development and introduce students to current industry trends. The workshop focussed on essential web development concepts, combining front-end and back-end technologies. It covered ReactJS for creating dynamic user interfaces, Node.js as a back-end runtime environment, and Express.js as a framework for building web servers. The workshop also looked at RESTful services using HTTP methods like GET, POST, PUT, and DELETE. It included database models such as NoSQL (MongoDB) and RDBMS, comparing their flexibility and structure. Overall, the workshop highlighted how different technologies work together to create scalable, efficient, and modern web applications.

**Cansaulim Field Trip:** TYBCA and SYBCA students were taken on a field trip to the village of Cansaulim. The main intent of the field trip was to capture photographs as part of image capture in multimedia. They visited the Chapel of St. Lawrence in Arossim, where they learned about the issue of “Double Tracking” and how the villagers had protested against it, demanding an overpass bridge or some solution to help them move freely. They also visited a small cross, which holds deep significance to the villages and offered a peaceful scenic experience. They also visited the Temple of Shri Damodar in Murdi, Cansaulim as well as the Three Kings Chapel of Cansaulim, located on a hilltop. The trip was co-ordinated by Mr. Worrel D’Souza and Ms Rushita Verlekar.

**Visit to Studio:** On September 18, 2025, SYBCA students visited the Mass Communication and Journalism Studio, under the guidance of Mr Worrel D’Souza. The purpose of the visit was to gain practical exposure to the functioning of media equipment and to understand the process of recording and live editing. ## Department of Biotechnology

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Alumni Guest lecture Series:** A guest lecture was organised on September 19, 2025 on the topic “Mastering smart food choices: Making food your first medicine” by Ms Sharwani Walke, a Registered Associate Nutritionist by Association for Nutrition, UK. The session provided an inspiring insight into choosing the right types of food to eat, how sleep patterns can affect hunger and how proteins delay digestion of complex carbohydrates and prevents sugar spike. Sharwani shed light on the proportions of proteins, vegetable, carbohydrate and fats

in a healthy plate. She debunked many food myths and stressed on how food can be our first and most important medicine. Sixty-eight FY, SY and TY students as well as six faculty members benefited from the session, gaining valuable insights into eating healthier and more mindfully.



**Mr. Farmer Field Trip:** On September 22, 2025, a field trip to Mr. Farmer Nursery, Guirim, was organised for the SYBSc Biotechnology. A total of 12 students participated in the visit, accompanied by Ms. Jenica Rangel, Assistant Professor in Botany. During the trip, Mr. Caraciol guided the students through the nursery, providing insights into various plant categories such as flowering plants, ornamental species, and fruit grafts.

The students also had the opportunity to explore the nursery outlet, which offers a wide range of gardening tools and essentials. On September 24, 2025, another 3 SY Biotechnology students, accompanied by Ms. Emma Fernandes, visited Mr. Farmer nursery. Under the guidance of Mr. Corasho Rodrigues, the students explored the nursery setup, including a wide variety of ornamental, spice, and medicinal plants, along with other facilities, thereby gaining valuable practical exposure to modern nursery management.



**STP Field trip:** A field trip was organised for the First Year Biotechnology students on October 3, 2025 to the Sewage Treatment Plant at Tonca, Panjim. Twenty-four students were accompanied by faculty members Ms. Jenica Rangel, Ms. Nerisa Lobo, and Dr. Larissa Menezes. Mr. Saiprasad Parab, Junior Engineer, explained the plant's functioning, highlighting its 27.5 MLD total capacity and the SBR (Sequential Batch

Reactor) technology used. Students observed various stages of wastewater treatment, including screening, oil and grease removal, aeration, sludge separation, and chlorination. They also visited the control room managing pumps and blowers. The visit provided valuable practical insights into sewage treatment processes and concluded with a group photograph.

**NFSU Visit:** A field trip was organised for the TY Biotechnology students on October 4, 2025 to the National Forensic Science University (NFSU), Goa Campus, Ponda. The visit, accompanied by Mr. Vishal Mardolkar and Dr. Larissa Menezes, aimed to familiarise 20 students with bioanalytical tools and techniques used in forensic science. Students were introduced to advanced instruments such as Gas Chromatography, HPLC, Fingerprint Kits, and PCR Instruments, along with their applications in DNA profiling, toxicology, and crime scene investigation. They also explored the Forensic Science Museum, which showcased major crime case mappings and a model crime scene for practical understanding. The visit provided valuable insight into the integration of biotechnology in forensic analysis, enhancing students' practical knowledge and inspiring interest in careers and research within forensic and allied sciences.



**Transect Walk:** A field trip was organised to Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Garden, Mapusa on October 6, 2025 for the SYBSc Biotechnology Batch I students. The students were accompanied by Ms. Jenica Rangel. During the visit, students explored the diverse plant species present in the garden and recorded observations on their scientific and common names, habit, importance, and life span. The activity provided

students with a hands-on understanding of plant diversity and helped reinforce theoretical knowledge through field-based learning. On October 8, 2025, SYBSc Biotechnology Batch II students, led by Ms. Emma Fernandes, went to the Garden. ## Department of Psychology – P.G.

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED

**Careers in Psychology and Studying Abroad:** As part of its Distinguished Alumni Series a session featuring Ms. Melissa D'Costa, Counselor, Global Reach was held on session on July 17, 2025. Speaking on “Careers in Psychology and Studying Abroad”, Ms. D'Costa shared insights from her own academic journey and professional practice, inspiring students to explore diverse domains within psychology such as counselling, organizational psychology, and neuropsychology. She provided practical guidance on higher education opportunities abroad, including university selection, application processes, and scholarships, while also addressing the cultural and academic adjustments required for success overseas. The session was coordinated by Dr. Kshipra Vora.

**Research Coffee Series:** The Department conducted a session under the Research Coffee Series on July 25, 2025, where MA Part II students presented their dissertation proposals before the Department Faculty Council. **Bridging the Gap:** An interactive session between MA Part I and MA Part II students called “Bridging the Gap” was organised on July 17, 2025. Senior students shared their motivations for pursuing psychology and reflected on their learning journey, offering valuable insights into coursework, research, and applied practice. The visit to Fort Aguada and its museum allowed students to appreciate Goa's rich cultural and historical heritage. Discussions emphasised the influence of local traditions, colonial history, and cultural context on social behaviour and psychological perspectives. Ms. Maryjane De Souza and Ms. Janice Zuzarte coordinated the trip.

**Celebrating Diversity and Inclusivity:** On September 26, 2025, Navratri was celebrated as part of the Department's Diversity and Inclusivity initiatives. ## Department of Physical Chemistry – P.G.

### ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED



**Workshop on Research:** A three-part workshop titled “Reference Manager Tool Series A, B & C” was organised on August 18, September 16, and September 23, 2025 for M.Sc. Part II students, aimed at enhancing modern research skills and improving academic productivity. The sessions were conducted by Ms. Flavia Travasso. Series A introduced students to reference management fundamentals using Zotero and

Mendeley, with hands-on training in installation, setup, and efficient use of both tools for organizing research bibliographies. Series B focused on mastering essential chemical drawing software—ChemSketch and ChemDraw. Series C advanced students’ understanding of scientific data handling through Origin 8 Pro, covering graph plotting, data analysis, and integration with Excel spreadsheets. Ms. Travasso also explained differences between Origin Pro 8.0 and Origin 8, followed by practical demonstrations on data import/export and graph creation. The workshop provided participants with comprehensive, hands-on training essential for effective research documentation and presentation.

**Visit to NFSU:** The Department, along with the Department of Biotechnology, organised an educational visit to the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU), Ponda, on October 4, 2025. Students were warmly welcomed by the institution’s staff, who began with an introductory talk on forensic laws, protocols, and the significance of the field. The group visited several facilities, including the Forensic Chemistry Lab, Biology Lab, Fingerprint and Questioned Document Lab, Cyber Security Lab, and the Crime Scene Museum. Mapusa-Goa, in collaboration with the Directorate of Planning, Statistics and Evaluation (DPSE), Govt. Of Goa conducted a one-day Aadhaar Update Camp on September 20, 2025 on the college campus. The programme was attended by 247 students across all streams. It concluded with an appeal to students to remain vigilant, compassionate, and proactive in addressing substance abuse. The Nodal Officer was assisted by Dr. James D'Souza (Botany), Ms. Zarina Chowdari (Commerce), Mr. Clarence Rodrigues (Chemistry), and Mr. Prasad S. Naik (Political Science) in organising the event.
- A related session on "General Awareness on Illegal Use of Narcotic Drugs" was conducted on August 9, 2025 by the UG and PG Departments of Chemistry. Ms. Meghna Jadhav served as the resource person. The session focused on the meaning of drugs, addiction, consequences, and government support schemes. She explained key terms such as "precursors" and "synthetic chemicals" and described the effects of various drug types including opioids, stimulants, and depressants. A live demonstration of the Tele-MANAS helpline familiarised students with how to access mental health support. On August 7, 2025, the College also organised an Essay Competition on "Nasha Mukt Abhiyan", in response to a circular from the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa. Conducted under the Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, the competition encouraged students to reflect on the ill effects of drug abuse and promote a drug-free lifestyle. Seventy-three students participated.



### Centre for Indian Knowledge System

From August to September 2025, the Centre for Indian Knowledge System, in collaboration with the Department of History, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, organised an enriching Coffee Table Series titled "The Wonder That Was Bharat." This initiative engaged TYBA History students in interactive research discussions focusing on India's cultural, historical, and scientific achievements. The activity provided an informal platform for students and faculty to explore three key aspects of ancient India—Transportation, Art, and Indigenous Food. The activity was coordinated by Dr. Sharmila Pais and Fr. Luis Gomes.

### Centre for Value Education and Community Engagement

The Centre for Value Education and Community Engagement of St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, Goa, in collaboration with the IQAC, organised a session on "Communication & Etiquettes" on December 6, 2025 at Don Bosco, Odxel. The session was conducted by Fr. Ramiro Luis, Convener of the Centre. The programme aimed at developing students' communication skills, enhancing critical thinking and problem-solving abilities, and nurturing social etiquette and responsible behaviour, both offline and online. The session was highly interactive and engaging. Games that drew important life lessons were conducted by Fr. Ramiro, through which students were encouraged to reflect on real-life situations. These activities helped participants understand the importance of clear communication, active listening, teamwork, empathy, and respectful behaviour in everyday life. The games also enabled students to recognise how attitudes and responses play a vital role in building healthy interpersonal relationships.

## St. Xavier's College Wellness Centre



In celebration of World Mental Health Day 2025, the St. Xavier's College Wellness Centre organised a campus initiative titled Calm Corner – Mindful Moments with Colour on October 10, 2025. Trained student volunteers engaged participants by explaining the concept and benefits of mindfulness. Students were encouraged to express themselves through mindful colouring activities and were provided with colouring sheets containing positive affirmations along with take-away colour bundles. Forty students also registered for a dedicated WhatsApp group managed by the college counsellor, where regular

affirmations, quotes, and well-being tips will be shared. Participants were further guided through a QR code linking them to additional mindfulness resources.

As part of the observance of World Mental Health Day 2025, the St. Xavier's College Wellness Centre, in collaboration with the Department of Psychology, organised a student development session titled Mindfulness – The Power of Gratitude on October 10, 2025. The one-hour session was facilitated by Ms. Sandra D'Mello, College Counsellor. The session aimed to enhance students' mental well-being by introducing mindfulness and gratitude-based practices. Students were first oriented to the concept of mindfulness through reflective discussions and the "Three What Skills" – Observe, Describe, and Participate.

Also as part of the observance of World Mental Health Day 2025, the St. Xavier's College Wellness Centre organized a panel discussion titled "The Weight We Carry – Mental Health, Burnout, and the Student Experience" on October 10, 2025. The panellists discussed how students often overestimate their capacities, leading to excessive workloads and emotional exhaustion. The impact of continuous assessments, institutional expectations, and broader influences such as the National Education Policy and issues related to self-expression. Emphasis was placed on understanding burnout as a result of academic, personal, and social pressures.

An Organ Donation Awareness Talk was organized by the St. Xavier's Wellness Centre in collaboration with the MOHAN Foundation and the NSS Unit of St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, on September 16, 2025. The session aimed to create awareness about organ and body donation while addressing medical, ethical, and legal aspects. Resource person Mr. Gabriel Pereira explained the importance of organ donation, the role of the MOHAN Foundation, and clarified concepts such as brain stem death and circulatory death with the aid of a video. Students were informed about donor types, the urgency of transplants, and procedures for pledging organs. A recipient's testimony added emotional depth to the session. The NSS Unit further reinforced the message through a street play during recess. The talk enhanced student awareness and dispelled misconceptions. A total of 310 students attended the session.

## Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)



St. Xavier's College organised a six-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on "Open Educational Resources and Artificial Intelligence in Teaching and Research" from October 18-24, 2025. The programme was designed to equip faculty members across disciplines with practical skills in AI tools and OERs in alignment with the National Education Policy. The FDP was inaugurated by Prof. (Dr.) Gervasio S. F. L. Mendes, Additional Director, Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa, in the presence of college authorities and invited dignitaries.

The workshop-mode FDP featured hands-on sessions led by eminent resource persons. Dr. Osborne Terrence D'Souza introduced participants to prompt engineering and AI tools for teaching and research. Prof. Gaurang Patkar emphasized AI-powered leadership and demonstrated interactive teaching platforms. Communication skills and professional presence were addressed by Mr. Ashwin Mushran through engaging practical exercises. The final sessions by Prof. Santhosh Kumar G and Prof. S. Senthilnathan focused on AI integration in pedagogy, assessment, and access to global OER platforms. The valedictory session was graced by Shri Joshua D'Souza, MLA and alumnus, who highlighted the FDP's transformative potential.

**Staff Enrichment Programme:** A session on Artificial Intelligence was conducted for the non-teaching staff on October 22, 2025. The session aimed to introduce participants to the practical use of AI for improving efficiency and smart working. The resource person, Dr. Gaurang Patkar, highlighted the relevance of AI in routine administrative work. Dr. Patkar's session focused on the basics of AI, the difference between conventional and generative AI, prompt engineering, and the use of AI tools such as ChatGPT for drafting letters, reports, and emails.



## St. Xavier's College: Student Council 2025-26





**Quiz:** The MY Bharat-VBYLD 2026 Quiz was conducted on August 4, 2025 to encourage student participation in a national-level knowledge initiative. The online quiz link was circulated and saw participation from over 250 students.

**Actizen Project Orientation:** The NSS Unit, in collaboration with the Desh Apnaye Foundation, organised an Actizen Project Orientation on September 13, 2025 for North Goa NSS Programme Officers and on September 25, 2025 for NSS Volunteers. The session witnessed enthusiastic participation from NSS volunteers of St. Xavier's College and other institutions across North Goa. Resource persons Ms. Irene Noronha and Mr. Daniel D'Souza guided participants through interactive discussions and engaging activities on civic responsibility, ethical leadership, and community engagement.

**Organ Donation:** The Health and Wellness Cell, in collaboration with the NSS Unit, conducted a street play in the college lobby to create awareness on organ donation. The play aimed to highlight the importance of donating organs to save lives and promote a culture of compassion and social responsibility.

**“Step into the Shoes”:** This event, coordinated by Dr. Rheane Da Silva along with PROs Reema Bhaip and Garvit Jaitawat in association with Cell for Inclusivity and Diversity, (Divyangjan) was a beautiful experience that helped participants understand what it truly means to empathise with people who face disabilities in their daily lives. Posters were displayed in the background for the deaf, the blind, and those with other physical disabilities to spread awareness and encouraged empathy. Through fun yet meaningful activities like blindfold challenges, the Whisper Challenge, letter writing, and hopscotch, students and teachers got a small glimpse of the struggles that others go through, and how a bit of patience and understanding can make a big difference.

**Cleanliness drives:** Regular cleanliness drives have been held on all working days. NSS volunteers actively participated in cleaning outdoor areas such as pathways, courtyards, gardens, and open spaces across the campus.

**Clothes Donation Drive:** A clothes donation drive was held in collaboration with Sampurn(E)arth Environmental Solutions Pvt. Ltd., from September 24-29, 2025. The drive aimed to promote sustainability and social awareness in line with Sustainable Development Goal 12 – Responsible Consumption and Production. Dr. Prachi Joshi coordinated the drive.

**Food & Grocery Donation:** A Food and Grocery Donation Drive from September 21-27, 2025 at the NSS Office. The initiative aimed to promote social responsibility and encourage students to contribute toward supporting community welfare.

**Beach Clean-up:** India's coastal cleanup event, held on September 20 at Calangute Beach, Goa, was a resounding success, with participants collecting significant amounts of waste, including plastic bottles, fishing nets, and gutka sachets. The total waste collected included 600 kg of recyclable plastic and 700 kg of other dry waste. The event was organized by the Union Ministry of Environment in collaboration with the Naval Unit of Goa. This activity was coordinated by Mr. Swapnil Belekar.

## MoU Activities



**MoU with Xavier Centre of Historical Research Porvorim,** the Department of History conducted an internship programme. Twelve students participated in the programme, working with the visual art of Gritli von Mittwalner. The programme was conducted by Dr. Sharmila Pais and supervised by Fr. Rinald D'Souza, Director of XCHR.

**MoU with Dalgado Konkani Academy:** The Department of Konkani initiated a Certificate Course on Romi Orthography under the MoU. The course commenced in June 2025 and is scheduled to conclude in February 2026. The programme aims to enhance students' linguistic competence in reading, writing, and standardising Konkani in the Romi script, which holds significant cultural and literary importance. A total of 19 students from St. Xavier's College enrolled for the course. The curriculum includes theoretical inputs on the evolution and standardisation of Romi orthography, along with practical writing exercises and guided discussions to ensure accuracy and consistency in usage. The course is jointly coordinated by Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes, Department of Konkani, and Mr. Celso Fernandes, President, DKA. Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes also serves as the Resource Person.



**MoU with GKB Hi Tech Lenses:** The Department of Physics organised a 60-hour internship programme under the MoU with GKB Hi Tech Lenses, Tivim Industrial Estate, Karaswada, Mapusa, under the Memorandum of Understanding signed on February 15, 2025. The internship was conducted from July 3, 2025 and aimed to provide students with practical industrial exposure relevant to their academic learning. The programme offered students

offered students hands-on experience in an industrial environment, enabling them to understand real-world applications of physics concepts in lens manufacturing and related technologies. The internship facilitated interaction with industry professionals and familiarised students with industrial practices, work ethics, and technical processes. The programme was coordinated by Mr. Pradeep Morajkar, with Prof. Nelson Lobo serving as Head and Co-coordinator. A total of five students participated in the internship and successfully completed the required duration. ‘



The 24<sup>th</sup> Shenoi Goembab Kathamall, a prestigious Konkani storytelling competition, was successfully conducted on August 2, 2025, under the **MoU with Konkani Bhasha Mandal (KBM)**, Margao. Held simultaneously at 19 centres across Goa, St. Xavier's College served as the Bardez taluka centre for this state-level literary initiative. The competition aimed to promote the Konkani language and nurture

storytelling skills among school students and was conducted across three categories: Std I-IV, Std V-VII, and Std VIII-X. At the Mapusa centre, 162 students from various schools in Bardez taluka participated enthusiastically, while approximately 1,227 students participated across the state. A panel of 27 judges ensured fair and systematic evaluation. The first and second prize winners from each category qualified for the final round at the state level. The event celebrated young linguistic talent and reinforced collective efforts to preserve and promote Konkani language and culture.



**MoU with BNI:** St. Xavier's College, Mapusa entered into a MoU with BNI on June 27, 2025 with the Centralized Training, Internship and Placement (TIP) Cell of the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) and Business Network International (BNI) to foster student mentorship, entrepreneurial guidance, and hyper-local business networking. As part of this collaboration, a World Entrepreneur Day event was held on August 21, 2025 under the theme "Swayampurna Yuva – Viksit Goa" at Terminal Banquets, Caculo Mall, Panaji. The event aimed to encourage entrepreneurial thinking among students and provide access to central and state-level financial and mentoring support. Resource persons, including Mr. Floyd Tavares and Mr. Mousin Shaikh, shared insights on entrepreneurship and business development. BNI and DHE felicitated Mr. Bhikaji Gawade (TYBSc Electronics) as "Young Best Student Entrepreneur." Four students participated, accompanied by faculty coordinators. The initiative strengthened industry-academia collaboration and promoted entrepreneurship among students.

**Under the MoU with Kilowatt** a Roadshow and Pre-Placement Talk was organised on September 10, 2025 by the Training, Internship and Placement (TIP) Cell in collaboration with the BBA, BCA, and Mass Communication and Journalism departments of St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. The session was held in Room No. 322, Library Block, and was conducted by representatives of Nordic Intent, a venture studio based in Europe and the United States, along with Kilowatt. It enabled students to gain clarity about potential placement opportunities and the importance of skill development. A total of 78 students benefited from the session.

**Internship:** The Department of Konkani organised a 60-hour Internship Programme on Translation and Transliteration in collaboration with **Konkani Bhasha Mandal (KBM)**, Margao, under the existing Memorandum of Understanding. The programme was conducted from September 6-26, 2025. The internship aimed to enhance students' practical language skills and familiarise them with professional applications of Konkani. It comprised two modules of 30 hours each. The Translation module, conducted by Ms. Sneha Sabnis, focused on translating literary and functional texts with attention to accuracy, context, and linguistic nuances. The Transliteration module, handled by Mr. Valley Quadros, trained students in systematic script conversion while maintaining phonetic and linguistic integrity. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes and Ms. Ratnamala Divkar.



**MoU with Prudent Media:** The Department of Mass Communication and Journalism organised an industry visit to Prudent Media (Goa) Pvt. Ltd., Panaji, on September 25, 2025 as part of the Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions. The visit aimed to provide students with practical exposure to the functioning of television and print newsrooms. Students visited Prudent TV News Channel, The Goan Everyday, and Bhaangarbhui, where they were briefed on newsroom operations, programme production, and news reporting processes by Mr. Kuldeep Asgaonkar, Programme Producer, and Ms. Austina Fernandes, Senior Manager (HR). Mr. Pramod Acharya, Editorial Director, interacted with students on media practices in Goa, emphasizing fact-checking, digital transformation, audience engagement, and ethical challenges in journalism.



**MOU with Kilowott:** St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, Goa, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Kilowott on September 30, 2025. The agreement was formalised by Mr. Kirk Duarte (Manager – HR, Kilowott), Ms. Rachel D'Souza (HR Executive), Ms. Ursula Barretto (Officiating Principal), and Ms. Vanessa Zita Furtado (Assistant Professor and Coordinator). The MoU aims to strengthen industry-academia collaboration by providing students with opportunities for internships, live projects, placements, and hands-on learning in the fields of digital strategy, branding, and business consulting. It also seeks to enhance faculty-industry interaction to ensure academic content remains relevant to current market trends. This partnership is expected to enhance student employability, foster innovation, and build stronger linkages between the institution and the corporate world. The MOU is being coordinated by Ms. Vanessa Furtado.

**MoU with Soul Travelling** This year, the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism partnered with a significant stakeholder as part of its MoU with Soul Travelling, who were part of the international Event 'Purple Fest 2025'. Twelve students aided Soul Travelling from October 9-12, 2025.

**MOU with Skills World:** A Memorandum of Understanding between St. Xavier's College and Skills World, Computer Institute was entered into on October 9, 2025. On October 13, 2025, St. Xavier's College, Goa formalized its partnership with the Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industry (GCCCI) through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).





**MoU with Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industry:** A Cluster Level Workshop on “MSME – Cost and Competitiveness of MSMEs in India” was held on November 5, 2025 at the Goa Chamber of Commerce & Industry, Surendrababu Timblo Convention Hall, Panjim, Goa. The workshop was organised by the Office of the Development Commissioner (MSME), Goa, with the objective of understanding challenges faced by MSMEs and exploring strategies to enhance their competitiveness and sustainability. The college was represented by Mr. Bhikaji Gawade (TYBSc) and Ms. Arya Katarpawar (TYBCom), accompanied by Mr. Vernon Desa, faculty member from the BBA Department. The sessions highlighted opportunities and challenges in sectors such as shipbuilding, food processing, and pharmaceuticals. Key issues discussed included access to finance, regulatory constraints, market linkages, and technological adoption. The workshop provided valuable insights into government policies, MSME schemes, and real-world business challenges, enhancing students’ understanding of the critical role MSMEs play in India’s economic development.

**MoU with St. Francis College for Women, Hyderabad:** St. Xavier’s College hosted a Student Exchange Programme on November 13, 2025 under the Memorandum of Understanding with St. Francis College for Women, Hyderabad. The programme was organised by the Department of Microbiology and aimed to promote academic collaboration, cultural exchange, and mutual learning between the two institutions. A total of 42 undergraduate and postgraduate students from St. Francis College for Women, accompanied by faculty members, participated in the programme. The event began with a prayer service followed by an inaugural session, during which the Officiating Principal highlighted the importance of collaborative learning and exchange initiatives. The academic segment included two technical sessions delivered by faculty members of the Department of Microbiology, St. Xavier’s College, on emerging areas of microbiology. The programme also featured cultural performances showcasing Goan traditions, followed by a guided tour of the campus and laboratories. The exchange programme successfully strengthened academic ties and encouraged future collaborative initiatives between the two institutions.





**Under the MoU with Sodiem Village Panchayat**, a training programme was held on Mushroom Cultivation for women entrepreneurs on September 19, 2025

**MoU with Glenmark Pharmaceuticals:** Five students from Department of Chemistry and Biotechnology were selected under the prestigious ATOM programme of Glenmark industry in the summer vacation. The students experienced and learned various working strategies in the pharmaceutical area. The activity was conducted under the MOU with Glenmark Pharmaceutical Ltd.



**MoU with Kripa Foundation, Anjuna** A Summer Internship Programme was conducted at Kripa Foundation, Anjuna, from May 6, 2025 to June 21, 2025, coordinated by Ms. Elvira Pereira, Assistant Professor and Convenor of the MoU, Department of Psychology, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. A total of 26 students participated in the programme. The internship provided students with hands-on exposure to drug de-addiction and rehabilitation services. Participants observed and engaged with various aspects of the rehabilitation process, including counselling sessions, group

sharing activities, and the daily functioning of a therapeutic care setting. The programme helped students understand the psychological, emotional, and social dimensions of addiction and recovery.

International Drug De-addiction Day was observed on June 26, 2025 at Kripa Foundation, Anjuna, with the aim of creating awareness about the growing problem of substance abuse and promoting preventive strategies. The programme was attended by 25 students, accompanied by Ms. Elvira Pereira, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa. The event was graced by several dignitaries from law enforcement, social welfare, and allied sectors, including the Superintendent of Police and local MLA Mrs. Delilah Lobo. A key highlight of the programme was an informative session by Mr. Manguesh Pednekar, In-charge of the Anti-Narcotic Cell, who addressed the alarming rise in drug abuse, particularly among youth. He emphasized the role of enforcement agencies and the shared responsibility of educational institutions, families, and society in combating substance misuse.





Certificate Course in Spoken Konkani was successfully conducted from June 24 to July 19, 2024 as a state-level academic initiative. The course was organised by the Department of Konkani, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, in collaboration with the **Thomas Stephens Konknni Kendr (TSKK), Porvorim**, as part of the MoU between the two institutions. Held at the TSKK Seminar Hall, the course spanned 40 hours

over 20 days, with daily sessions conducted from 2:30-5:30 pm. A total of nine students enrolled in the course, which aimed to strengthen spoken Konkani skills through structured and practical learning. The programme featured expert sessions by distinguished resource persons. The sessions were conducted by Mr. Dharma Chodankar, Mr. Silvester Vaz, Ms. Aashita Naik, Fr. Jose Silveira, Ms. Swara Pednekar, and Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes, with coordination by Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes and Fr. Kelwin Monteiro.

The Abbé Faria Postgraduate Department of Psychology, St. Xavier's College, Mapusa, organised a one-month internship under its Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the **Sethu Centre for Child Development and Family Guidance, Saligao**, from May 8 to May 31, 2024. The internship was undertaken by Ms. Heloise D'Souza, a postgraduate student of Psychology, with the objective of providing hands-on professional exposure in the field of child development and mental health. The internship offered valuable experiential learning by bridging theoretical knowledge with real-world practice. Ms. D'Souza was exposed to a multidisciplinary clinical environment and observed the work of paediatricians, clinical psychologists, occupational therapists, speech therapists, and physiotherapists.

St. Xavier's College, Mapusa in collaboration with **Vidhya Prabhodini College, Porvorim**, organised a lecture on "Electronic Journalism" on October 4, 2025. The programme was conducted as an intercollegiate MoU activity, strengthening academic collaboration between the two institutions. The session was led by Shailendra Mehta, a noted journalist and Konkani writer, who delivered an engaging and informative lecture on the evolving field of electronic journalism. A total of 39 student from both colleges

participated in the programme. The lecture was coordinated by Dr. Fr. Luis Gomes. During the session, the speaker discussed the concept, significance, advantages, and limitations of electronic journalism, along with a brief historical overview of electronic media and its impact on contemporary journalism.





An educational visit to Sangath, Porvorim, was organised on September 16, 2025 for 30 FYBA Psychology (Major) students. The visit formed part of an academic exposure programme, facilitated by an **MoU with Sangath**, aimed at providing students with practical insights into the field of psychology and mental health. During the visit, students attended interactive sessions conducted by professionals associated

with Sangath, who shared their personal experiences and professional journeys. These sessions highlighted the organization's contribution to mental health research, interventions, and community-based work. The open and engaging format encouraged students to ask questions and actively participate in discussions, helping them gain clarity about career opportunities and pathways in psychology. She further elaborated on key counselling skills including reflecting feelings, summarizing concerns, and fostering hope in clients. To enhance experiential learning, Ms. Sequeira, along with her colleagues Ms. Lallan and Ms. Sejal, conducted interactive role-plays demonstrating effective counselling techniques.
